#### LEADERSHIP IN GIVING: AN APPEAL FOR PHILANTHROPY AND SERVICE BY THE INDIAN/BENGALI COMMUNITY

S. S. Rama Rao Papu, Ph.D. J. K. Bhattacharjee, Ph.D. Oxford, Ohio

Recent studies of the Indian community show that, as an ethnic minority, the Indians in North America are excelling in the arts and sciences, medicine, education and business. The Indian community is also said to be one of the more prosperous and flourishing communities in America. As the first generation of Indians is graying, and the second generation is coming on its own, we must reflect on taking a leadership role in philanthropy, community service and volunteerism, fields largely neglected, if not ignored by us as a community.

- 1. The Importance of DANA in Indian Tradition: Dana (charity, sharing), asteya (non-possession), tyaga (sacrifice) and samnyasa (life-renunciation) play an important role in the Indian life-world. Tyaga, asteya and samnyasa are considered ideals, and are therefore morally optional, whereas dana is morally obligatory, which everyone must engage in.
- 2. Philanthropy as an Obligation: From Ashoka to Gandhi, charity is considered a strict obligation. Dana or gifting is the method which the Indians have adopted from times immemorial to promote art, architecture, music, literature, philosophy, temple building, construction of dharmasalas (rest houses), hospitals for humans, birds and beasts.

magine how poor Indian culture and civilization would have been, if there was no large-scale gifting activities by the kings and emperors, the rich and the business community. By their giving activities, Indians have also maintained a stable economic and social order. For gifting is the method of transfer of private ownership to communal ownership, from those who *have* to those who *need*. In return, gifting also the means of attaining social reputation and honor. According to the *Isa Upanishad* everything that exists belongs to the Lord, and therefore one should *enjoy by renunciation*. While singing our *aarati*, we say "tana mana dhana jo kuch <u>hai sab hii hai teraa etc</u>. i.e. "O Lord, whatever I have - body, mind and wealth -belong to You, what do I lose by giving up everything which you have given to me and which does not belong to me.

- 3. The Need for Gifting by the Indian-Americans: The duty of gifting by the Indian American community needs no emphasis because (i) we are all cultural ambassadors to the best Indian traditions and <u>dana</u> as an obligation does not cease when we leave the shores of India; (ii) as citizens of America, we are receivers from and beneficiaries of the American (economic) dream,
- but not "givers" in any adequate way; (iii) that by giving, we will be creating a stable multi-dimensional relationship with other ethnic groups and the community at large (imagine whether the "dot buster" movement would have arisen in New Jersey a few yearsa ago if we had been engaged in social welfare programs also along with our business activities there); (iv) that we shall build our reputations in the Indian and American communities (like the Watumull family in Hawaii whose name is a household word there, or the Hinduja family which is well-known all over the world); (v) and finally by giving we will set a good example for our children to follow.
- 4. What is our fair share in gifting? "Give till it hurts" is the principle of <u>dana</u>. <u>Dana</u> unlike <u>tyaga</u>, aims at the minimum, not at the maximum. The concept of "hurting" may be interpreted as "the principle of least inconvenience". Thus, when our giving up anything does not involve something of great significance, but involves only minimal inconvenience, then we have an obligation to give that up for charitable purposes. For example, if by giving up a beer, or eating out or buying an extra new dress, causes us only a minimal inconvenience, but will bring about a much larger good for someone, like feeding a hungry child from starvation, we have an obligation to donate the money so saved for <u>dana</u>. <u>Dana</u>, however, is more than gifting material goods (<u>dhana</u>). It also includes offering physical and mental (<u>tana</u>, <u>mana</u>), support physically helping and showing sympathy to those who are suffering and engaging in acts of compassion (<u>karuna</u>) to care for them. The beneficiaries of gifting our material possessions (<u>dhana</u>) are the poor, the "have nots," but everyone, poor and rich, can be the recipient of <u>karuna</u>. In the modern context, this includes volunteerism, community service, good samaritanship etc. Thus, following volunteerism and service, we have an obligation to utilize our time in alleviating suffering wherever it exists, in rich homes and poor homes alike.
- 5. How much and to whom shall we give? We should make a resolution, in the beginning of every year, as to how much we can give monetarily and in service activities. We should set our priorities between local (e.g. building a temple, a community hall) and global projects (e.g. building a school or hospital in India); projects which are of an emergency nature (famine relief in Sudan and hurricane relief in Florida, flood or earthquake relief in India) and those which benefit the enrich the culture of the community in the long run (construction of an Arts Center). We should find the right cause or project and ask if not us who, and if not now, when, we will we support the project. Most people set up a part of their estate for charitable family trust, but by giving while living, one can see for oneself the results that make the difference.
- (a) <u>Local Projects</u>: What project to select and how? Experts recommend that we support local credible projects and to be cautious of "mail order projects" (projects of unknown credibility), no matter how noble they may appear. Suggested local projects to volunteer our time and provide support for are: schools, little league and colleges as booster, scholarships, mentoring disadvantaged students, special projects (civil and political) of the community; local hospitals, retirement homes, soup kitchens in downtowns (Cincinnati, Dayton), the United Way, Red Cross, Salvation Army, weekend free clinics by physicians, Indian community blood drive, etc. In our own backyard, the ongoing local projects of the Indian (Bengali) community include the Gandhi Jayanthi canned food drive for the Cincinnati Freestore Food Bank, temple projects, cultural and educational activities for our children; community Gandhi House in Dayton for homeless single mothers; Rabrindranath Tagore Chair and India Studies Center at Indiana University in Bloomington. (b) <u>Global Projects</u>: Our global commitments should, to a large extent, include India but it should not be limited to India, like helping in projects to alleviate the current famine situation in Sudan.

Suggested projects for India, but not limited to are: the village literacy projects being pursued in Andhra Pradesh, share and care projects in Gujarat and elsewhere, the medical clinics of Dr. Vijayanagar, the Calcutta slum development project of Ramakrishna Mission, Bharat Seva Pratisthan, AID projects, free clinics by visiting physicians, free exchange of information and technical knowhow by visiting researchers and entrepreneurs.

- (c) <u>Examples for Children</u>: Such giving and services not only give us personal satisfaction and visibility/recognition in the local community, but will also provide our children with excellent examples for them to emulate and the donors act as role-models when they grow up.
- (d) <u>Partnership with Community Groups</u>: Last, but not least, members of the Indian community should join appropriate local civic and service organizations such as the Lions Club, Kiwanis Club, Rotary Club and Jaycees to provide service, leadership, recognition, visibility and support to the local, national and international projects and needs.



#### **EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE DECISIONS**

**NOVEMBER 7, 2004** 

The Executive Committee has considered the following issues facing the Temple:

- 1. The EC is very concerned with the leakage of water in the Temple. It appears there are several areas in the basement as well as in the main hall upstairs that are leaking. The EC is concerned that measures to stop the leaks are not effective. The EC is also concerned about the safety and health related issues arising from such leaks.
  - The EC has resolved to undertake an independent, comprehensive examination of the roof, plumbing, and ceiling in the Temple.
  - Any repairs to fix the water leaks will be carried out only after inviting multiple external bids from contractors. These contractors will be required to provide a warranty for a one or two year period to the effect that if the leaks are not controlled, they will be fixed at no additional cost to the Temple.
- 2. Until such a comprehensive examination is undertaken, the EC has initiated short term measures to control the water leaks.
- 3. The EC is taking steps to strengthen the security of the Temple premises. Towards this end, motion detectors as well as a video camera are being installed. In addition, special locks have been installed on the hundis. Further, a heavy safe will be bolted to the floor to prevent robbery of Temple cash.
