Significance and Symbolism of 'Om' Installed in **Hindu Temple of Greater Cincinnati** By Pundit B.C. Sharma

'Om' is the root of the holy scriptures Vedas. All the Vedic mantras start with the primeval sound 'Om' in the beginning. It is the seed of all the Vedic mantras. It is also called 'Naad Brahm'. The Om in our temple is seated in the middle of all the deities installed in the temple. It symbolizes that God is only one projected in different forms. He is omnipotent and omnipresent like the oil in in the oil seeds, fire in the match sticks and the electricity in the electric wires.

Characteristics of Om:

- It is made of pure crystal
- The world renowned master Great sculptors Maestro Pino Signorito of Favorvent city from Italy made this wonderful piece of art.
- It is a unique creation of its kind in the world. 3.
- Om in the middle of the deity platform indicates that there is no presiding deity in the temple. All the different deities are equal, important, adorable, inspirational, and the source of providing good luck, peace, prosperity, and happiness to all the devotees.

Member who has donated \$15,000 or more to the temple

Member who has served on the Executive Council minimum of four years

ARTICLE V: MANAGEMENT

Section 1.0 Add Following

The members of HSGC will elect 6 Board of Trustees (BOT) from the trustees of the HSGC during GBM. In addition, the President of the HSGC shall be one of the member of the BOT during his or her election period. There will be total seven members of BOT.

They will manage following functions

Long term facilities planning and work

Long term financial planning

Legal and Constitution Matter

Advise and consent with EC of the Temple.


BOARD OF TRUSTEES Add following sections

- Section 11.0 Number of Trustees The Board of Trustees shall consist of seven Trustees.
- Section 12.0 Terms of Office. Six Trustees shall

Be elected for the term of three years each.

- The President of the HSGC shall be a Trustee for a term co-terminus with his/her position as President of the HSGC.
- Section 13.0 <u>Election</u> The election for new Trustees shall be held at the same time as the election for members of the Executive Council
- Section 14.0 <u>Eligibility</u> To be eligible to serve on the Board of Trustees; a person must be a trustee living in Tristate area with the good standing in HSGC and the community.
- Section 15.0 <u>Chairperson</u> At the first meeting of the Trustees in each year, the Trustees shall elect from among their members, a chairperson who shall thereafter be designated the "Chairperson of the Board of Trustees". The president of the HSGC shall not be eligible to be the Chairperson of the Board of Trustees.
- Section 16.0 Quorum At all meetings of the Board of Trustees, a quorum shall consist of five or more Trustees holding the position in the board
- Section 17.0 <u>Voting All decisions to come before the Board of Trustees shall be decided by a minimum of four votes of the Trustees voting.</u>
- Section 18.0 Resignation A Trustee may resign by giving written notice to the Chairman of the Board of Trustees and to the President of the HSGC 30 days prior to the resignation.. A Trustee will be deemed to have resigned as of the date upon which he/she dies or becomes mentally disabled.
- Section 19.0 Removal Any Trustee may be removed by the majority vote of the members of the HSGC voting at a special meeting of the members called for the purpose of considering the removal of said Trustee, so long as a quorum is present at said meeting.
- Section 20.0 <u>Filling of Vacancies</u> Any vacancy in the Board of Trustees shall be filled by a majority vote of the remaining Trustees for the time until the next election of Trustees by the members.

Symbolism of Top Portion:

- 1. Its top most gold dot indicates the source of energy-Sun God in its heavenly abode.
- 2. The blue color arch indicates the sky and white spots within the blue represent the moon.
- 3. It means Om is God pervading in the whole universe from the celestial abodes of the Gods upto the Paatal Lok. Om pervades in everything and everything pervades in Om.

Symbolism of Side Arch:

The lotus flower represents Lord Brahma, the creator of this universe.

The Conch shell stands for Lord Vishnu, the preserver of this universe.

Trishul or the three-edged weapon indicates Lord Shiva as the Lord of Annihilation of this universe. So, this portion indicates that God is supreme and the supreme trinity is basically one. It is our lack of knowledge that we consider Lord Brahma, Vishnu, and Mahesh as three different entities-but basically they are only one under one syllable 'Om'. A beautiful sacred verse explains this important fact.

'Brahma Vishnu SadaShiv jaanat aviveka, Pranvakshar ke madhya yeh teenon hi eka'

Symbolism of Figure Shaped 3:

- 1. The young beautiful maiden stands for the mother nature known as the Adya Shakti, Maha Maya, Durga, Amba, Bhavani etc. The will power of Par Brahma and Kriya Shakti of Maha Maya work in harmony with each other to create this universe.
- 2. The different stages of human life from infancy to old age and death depict that the body is changeable, it has growth and development and ultimately decays. The soul is eternal, unchangeable and everlasting-because it is an integral part of the supreme soul 'Parmatama'.
- 3. Law of Karma determines the worth of a person after death. A person can never get rid of the circle of life and death unless he acts as a puppet in the hands of worldly ambitions and desires. The different stages of human life projected in this part of Om highlights this important fact of life.
- 4. A yogi or mystic sitting in meditation indicates that total surrender and complete dedication and devotion in the lotus feet of Almighty God can provide personal freedom from the bondage of life and death. Total surrender to the will of God is the only way to get salvation. It has to merge the individual soul in the Supreme Soul like the merging of a river in the mighty ocean. In fact union of the soul with the Supreme Soul is the ultimate aim of human life. It is called 'Moksha' and is higher than Dharma, Arth and Kaam, the three other major aims of human life.

Inspiration and Philosophy:

When the ordinary sand is heated at a very high temperature, it converts it into crystal. An ordinary soul is like that sand. When the individual disciplines his life and performs penance and surrenders himself to the will of God, he can obtain perfection. Specific penance can change purush into purushotum and not into Narayan. This divine transformation of self into supreme self can be obtained with strong will power, determination, sincere and constant efforts to lead a disciplined life based on the principles of scriptures. Last but not the least, with the blessings and grace of both the Guru and Govind, the spiritual teachers and supreme power Parmatama, moksha can be achieved.

The sacred symbol Om is constantly seated in the hearts of Yogis. It provides a seeker, success in worldly affairs and ultimately becomes an instrument of achieving liberation from bondage of life and death.

The Prakarti and Purush, they are both the major course of creation existence and annihilation of this universe and Om represents both of them. Shiv and Shakti or the Shakti and Shaktimaan are incomplete without each other. They do not oppose each other but supplement each other.

Om is the syllable which unites them. Let us sing the glory of Om by chanting the under mentioned Mantras:

'Om Karam Bindi Sanyuktam Nityam Dhayayanti Yogini Kaandam Moksha dam Chaiv Onkar aye Naamo Nami' 'Om Shanti Shanti Om'
