MAKARSANKRANTI OR UTTARAYAN

Maker Sankranti is one of the most auspicious days for the Hindus, and is celebrated all over the country in myriad cultural forms, with great devotion, fervor & gaiety. Lakhs of people take a dip in places like Ganga Sagar & Prayag and pray to Lord Sun. It is celebrated with pomp in southern parts of the country as Pongal, and in Punjab is celebrated as Lohri & Maghi. Gujarati's not only look reverentially up to the sun, but also offer thousands of their colorful oblations in the form of beautiful kites all over the skyline. They may be trying to reach up to their glorious God or bring about greater proximity with the one who represents the best. It is a day for which Bhishm Pitamah kept waiting to leave his mortal coil.

Makar in Sanskrit means Capricorn and Sankranti means to go from one place to another, one meets another, to change direction or transition. The time when the sun changes its direction from one constellation of the zodiac to another is known as Sankranti.



There are 12 signs of the zodiac. Therefore correspondingly there are 12 Sankrantis. They are given names according to the position of the sun in relation to the signs of the zodiac. Each of the 12 Sankrantis has its relevant importance but two of them are most prominent, the Mesh (Aries) Sankranti and the most important, the Makar (Capricorn) Sankranti.

Mesh Sankranti

The solar year commences when the sun is in Mesh (Aries), the first sign of the zodiac. This transition is called Mesh Sankranti. During this auspicious period, great deal of merits are acquired by performing Havan (Yajna or Sacred Fire ceremony), Japa (repetition of Mantra or God's name), Shraddha, Charity etc. Householders top up their grain jars and families start wedding preparations for their sons and daughters.

Makar Sankranti

The Makar Sankranti is of a great social and religious importance. Transition of the Sun from Sagittarius to Capricorn, during the winter solstice in the northern hemisphere is known as Makar Sankranti. From this day begins the six-month long Uttarayan, (Northern Transition) which is considered very auspicious for attaining higher worlds hereafter.

The traditional Indian calendar is based on lunar (moon) positions and Western calendar is based on solar (son) positions. Therefore the Western dates for all Hindu festivals do change but that of Makar Sankranti always remains the same which is 14th January. Makar Sankranti is celebrated in the Hindu calendar month of Magha. After this day the days gradually lengthened in the northern hemisphere.

Religious Significance and Legends:

- 1. The Puranas write that on this day Sun visits the house of his son Shani (Saturn), who is the Swami of Makar (Capricorn) .The father & son do not normally get along very well. In spite of all the differences between them Sungod makes a point to visit the son Shani, on this day. The father Sungod, in fact himself comes to his son's house, for a month. This day symbolizes the importance of special relationship between a father & son. It is the son who has the responsibility to carry forward his fathers dream and continue the family name.
- 2. From Uttarayan also called Devayan, starts the 'day' of Devatas, while Dakshinayan (Southern Transition of Sun) also called Pitrayan, is said to be the 'night' of Devatas, Most auspicious events are performed during Uttarayan time..
- 3. It was on this day when Lord Vishnu ended the ever increasing terrorism of the Asuras by finishing them off and burying their heads under the Mandar Parvat. This signifies the end of negativities and beginning of an era of righteous actions and living.
- 4. The great savior of his ancestors, Maharaj Bhagirath, did great Tapasya (penance) to bring Gangaji down on the earth for the redemption of 60,000 sons of Maharaj Sagar, who were burnt to ashes at the Kapil Muni Ashram, near the present day Ganga Sagar. It was on this day that Bhagirath finally did Tarpan with the Ganges water for his unfortunate ancestors and thereby liberated them from the curse. After visiting the Patala for the redemption of the curse of Bhagirath's ancestors Gangaji finally merged in the Sagar (Ocean). Even today a very big Ganga Sagar Mela is organized every year on this day at the confluence of River Ganges and the Bay of Bengal. Thousands of people take dip in the water and do Tarpan for their ancestors.

There is another spiritually symbolic aspect of this story. The 60,000 cursed son of Maharaj Sagar who represent our thoughts, became dull & very weak and almost dead, because of their uncivilized and blind ambition. Redemption of such people is only by the waters of Gangaji, brought down from heaven to earth with the first landing onto high Himalayas and then on the earth surface, by observing great Tapasya. This represents determination, hard work and dedication to receive the redeeming Brahma-Vidya, which alone enlightens, enthuses & enlivens the life of anyone.

5. The Bhagavad Geeta mentions the importance of the northern path of the sun at the time of death. This period is considered an auspicious time to conduct any religious practices and even death..

The great grandsire Bhishm of Mahabharata chose to die during this period. Bhishm fell to the arrows of Arjun. With his boon to choose the time of his death, he waited on a bed of arrows to depart from this world only during this period. It is believed that those who die during this period have no rebirth

Celebration through out India

This festival popularly called Sankrant is celebrated differently in different parts of India.

In **Uttar Pradesh,** Sankrant is called 'Khichiri'. Taking a dip in the holy rivers on this day is regarded as most auspicious. A big one-month long 'Magha-Mela' fair begins at Prayag (Allahabad) on this occasion. Apart from Triveni, bathing rituals also take place at many places like Haridvar and Garh Mukteshwar in Uttar Pradesh, and Patna in Bihar.

In **Bengal** every year a very big Mela is held at Ganga Sagar where the river Ganga is believed to have dived into the nether region and vivified the ashes of the sixty thousand ancestors of King Bhagirath. This mela is attended by a large number of pilgrims from all over the country.

In **TamilNadu** Sankranti is known by the name of **Pongal**, which takes its name from the surging of rice boiled in a pot of milk, and this festival has more significance than even Diwali. It is very popular particularly amongst farmers. Rice and pulses cooked together in ghee and milk is offered to the family deity after the ritual worship. "Share what you have with all"—this is the clarion call of the Pongal festival.

In **Andhra Pradesh,** it is celebrated as a three-day harvest festival **Pongal.** It is a big event for the people of Andhra Pradesh. The Telugus call it **'Pedda Panduga'** meaning big festival. The whole event lasts for four days; the first day is called Bhogi, the second day Sankranti, the third day Kanuma and the fourth day, Mukkanuma.

In **Karnataka**, the Sankranti is also known as **Pongal** It is marked by visiting one's friends and relatives to exchange greetings, and by the preparation of a dish called Ellu (made with sesame seeds, coconuts, sugar blocks, etc). A common custom found across Karnataka is the exchange of sugarcane pieces and Ellu with one's neighbors, friends and relatives and greet each other with the words " "Ellu bella thindu, Olle Maathu Aadu" (Eat sesame seeds and speak only good). The significance of this exchange is that sweetness should prevail in all the dealings. The cows and bullocks are gaily decorated and fed 'Pongal'- a sweet preparation of rice. Special prayers are offered. In the evening, the cattle are led out in procession to the beat of drums and music. In the night a bonfire is lit and the animals are made to jump over the fire.

In **Maharashtra** on the Sankranti day people exchange multi-colored tilgud made from Til (sesame seeds) and sugar and Til-laddus made from Til and jiggery. Til-polis are offered for lunch. While exchanging Tilguls as tokens of goodwill people greet each other saying – 'til-gul ghya, god god bola' meaning 'accept these tilguls and speak sweet words'. The under-lying thought in the custom is to forget the past ill-feelings and hostilities and resolve to speak sweet and remain friends. This is a special day for the women in Maharashtra when married women are invited for a get-together called 'Haldi-Kumkum' and given gifts of any utensil, which the woman of the house purchases on that day.

In **Gujarat** Sankrant is observed more or less in the same manner as in Maharashtra but with a difference that in Gujarat there is a custom of giving gifts to relatives. The elders in the family give gifts to the younger members of the family. The Gujarati Pandits on this auspicious day grant scholarships to students for higher studies in astrology and philosophy. This festival thus helps the maintenance of social relationships within the family, caste and community. Kite flying has been associated with this festival in a big way. It has become an internationally well-known event.

In **Punjab** where December and January are the coldest months of the year, huge bonfires are lit on the eve of Sankrant and is celebrated as "LOHARI". Sweets, sugarcane and rice are thrown in the bonfires, around which friends and relatives gather together. The following day is celebrated as MAGHI. The Punjabi's dance their famous Bhangra dance till they get exhausted. The celebration continues further by eating the sumptuous food that is specially prepared for the occasion.

In **Kerala** the 40 days anushthana by the devotees of Ayyappa ends on this day in **Sabarimala** with a big festival.

In **Madya Pradesh** and **Bundelkhand** this festival of Sankrant is known by the name **Sakarat** and is celebrated with great pomp & merriment accompanied by lot of sweets.

In Assam, the festival is celebrated as Bhogali Bihu.

Many **tribal communities** in India start their New Year from the day of Sankrant by lighting bonfires, dancing and eating their particular dishes sitting together. The Bhuya tribal of Orissa have their **Maghyatra** in which small home-made articles are put for sale.

In the **coastal regions**, it is a harvest festival dedicated to **Indra**...

Thus, the Makar Sankranti is celebrated throughout India as a harvest festival. It is a way of giving thanks to the elements of nature that help mankind. This is the period when the winter recedes, paving the way for the summer. It is the time the farmers bring home their harvest. In the coast al regions, it is a harvest festival dedicated to Indra. In North India, a ritual bath in the river is important on this day. Khichiri is eaten and given away as charity, and People also distribute rice and lentils to the poor and needy. In Maharashtra, a special dish called Tilgul and laddoos made of jiggery and Sesame seed, the chief crop of the season, is popular. In Gujarat it is celebrated as the Kite flying day. From Makar Sankranti onwards when the sun is traveling northwards, innumerable auspicious things start happening. Climate and atmosphere improve. It is noted that the Children born during this period are naturally progressive, well mannered, pleasant and of noble disposition.

Call it Makar Sankranti; Sankrant, Lohri, Pongal, Khichiri Sankranti, Khichadi Sankranti, or Til Sankranti the festival conveys the same message 'the bond of brotherhood and the spirit of oneness should prevail despite all odds'.

The Asian Comnimunity Alliance, Inc. (ACA) is a non-profit 501(c)3 organization that brings together resources to provide quality, compassionate and culturally sensitive services to the Asian Communities in the Greater Cincinnati Region.

ACA Work in the Community

During 2007, ACA in partnership with Northern Kentucky University held an Asian Summit to gather information from Asian leaders about the needs of our growing Asian community. That Summit resulted in the identification of several concerns among the area Asian populations including immigration, health including health insurance, access to public services, and lack of Asian representation.

Further ,ACA developed and began distribution of an **Asian Community Resource Guide** to assist Asian families arriving here in the Cincinnati region. This guide offers a wide range of information useful in becoming a part of this community. Topics in the guide include Schooling, US medical system, Legal information and services, Immigration, Social Service Organizations, Asian Embassies in the United States, Career Opportunities, Language Interpreters, Asian Community Organizations, and much more.

During the last year, **ACA's** <u>website (www.acacinci.org)</u> opened, enabling Asians in Cincinnati to become familiar with the organization and also allowing the Asian Communities to interact with each other. The website includes free registration and such features as:

Individual Asian based organizations and other organizations serving Asian populations can also link with ACA through the website. To do so an organization uses the "Links" menu on the website to register.

ACA also maintains broader outreach, participating as part of the statewide Ohio Asian American Health Coalition (OAAHC), a not-for-profit organization consisting of representatives of various Asian American community organizations in Ohio, health care professionals, students, and community leaders. The group focus is on some urgent Asian American health needs such as (1) hepatitis B and associ-ated liver can-cer(2) mental health, including domestic violence, and (3) prevention and control of tobacco use.

Over the coming year, ACA expects to focus on:

- An Asian Health Symposium during April with topics that include hepatitis B, cardiovascular diseases, diabetes & tobacco cessation.
- A hepatitis B screening & immunization project for the members of the Asian communities especially from China, Korea, Philippines, Vietnam & Cambodia
- An education and awareness program on hepatitis B for the Asian Cultural Festival held at the Cincinnati Museum center.
- Increasing the capacity to provide services for Asian populations through additional work with a statewide coalition on two health projects.


