AVIDYA IN ADVAITA VEDANT

S. S. Rama Rao Pappu, Professor of Philosophy & Comparative Religion, Miami University. Oxford, Ohio

Why do we think we are finite, though we are infinite? Why do we think we are suffering beings though our nature is one of bliss? Why do we think that the plurality we experience is real, though Reality is One without a second?

According to Advaita Vedanta it is because of Avidya (usually translated as "ignorance," "nescience" "unwisdom") what is infinite appears as finite, what is blissful appears as suffering and what is One appears as the Many, what is immortal appears as mortal. In Advaita Vedanta, Brahman or the Absolute, which is one without a second. whose essence is Truth (satyam), Knowledge (jnanam) and Bliss (ananda), is the only Reality - and the world of plurality is unreal, and the individual self (jiva) is identical with Brahman. In the Adhyasa Bhasya of his Commentary on Brahma Sutras, Sankara argues that the subject (I) and the Object (Thou/ That) are opposed to each other as light and darkness, the subject being one of Pure Consciousness (cit), the transcendental "I" and the object being the non-|, the "thisness/thatness" of things. Because of their heterogeneous natures, though the Subject and the Object cannot have any relations, yet because of Avidya we mistake the world as the Real, we mistake the Jiva (Ego) as the Self (Atman) and mistake the Known and Knowledge as having equal status with the Knower.

What is Avidya? Is it the absence of knowledge? Or is it a confused state where nothing is clear? Or is it false or mistaken knowledge where I have made an error? Can I know that I am an *ajnanin* (one who has no knowledge)? In other words, can I know that I do not know? According to Advaita Vedanta, there is no such thing as a state of unknowingness. The state of the Self (Atman) is one of "having known" though we have no awareness of it. Just as one can see oneself in a mirror by removing the dust that is covering it, so also with the removal of ignorance one realizes one's true self as Brahman. In the Vivarana School of Vedanta, it is said that "everything is known either as known or as unknown," and that "absence of knowledge" is not a total absence, or nothingness. This is a case in point in which the Advaitins argue at length. Absence of knowledge is not absence because that there is absence can only be known through knowledge. Suppose I walk into a lighted room and see the presence of a chair, we know positively that there is a chair. Now suppose I walk into a dark room and perceive the room to be dark. I therefore see nothing. I turn on the light and see a chair in the room. Just as the light dispels darkness and manifests the chair there, knowledge dispels ignorance and makes the objects manifest. The darkness which covered the chair, the "nothingness" which we see, is a positive fact just as the cognition of the chair after the darkness is dispelled. The Advaitins argue that awareness of nothing does not mean the nonawareness of anything. Awareness of nothing is another token of awareness, except that the awareness has not manifested anything. In addition, when an object is manifested by knowledge, my awareness is not only that I am aware of the chair, but also that I am aware of the non-existence of the chair in this room before the dawn of knowledge.

For the Advaitins there are not rwo kinds of facts - positive facts like the cognition of a chair and negative facts like the non-cognition of a chair. The non-cognition of a chair is as much a positive fact as the cognition of a chair, except in the non-cognition, we are aware of the absence-of- the-chair. Moreover, when we turn on the light and become aware of the chair, we have not only the awareness of the chair in the present, but also the awareness of the absence of the chair before we became aware of it and



HSGC to Partner with AIW / YWCA To Address DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

Immigrant Women against Domestic Violence

HSGC will be arranging a presentation on this topic. Time and venue will be announced soon

Despite the promise of America many immigrants have found it difficult to achieve the "American Dream". Little attention has been paid to immigrant women who are battered. Violence against women is universal and strikes in all cultures, race, ethnic, religious, age, and socio economic classes. However, battered immigrant women face even greater obstacles in their efforts to escape violent relationships with issues often compounded by problems associated with immigration, cultural, legal and language barriers. The Alliance for Immigrant Women (AIW) aims to raise awareness and address all these issues.

Battered immigrant women face many cultural, economic & legal barriers to seeking and receiving assistance. Abusers often use immigration related threats to assert control over their spouse's movements, emotions, relationship with the outside world, and potentially every aspect of their life. Due to language barriers, inexperience with U.S. law, and fear of deportation, immigrant women are underserved by the U.S. government, underrepresented in policy making, and vulnerable to basic human rights violations, especially domestic violence.

Alliance for Immigrant Women are making sure that addressing the needs of battered immigrants is an important part of
 their agenda. A great deal of education is required within both immigrant communities about the problem and potential solutions about the needs of immigrant women and their families and the barriers that keep them from seeking or receiving
 help.

The silence surrounding domestic violence in South Asian American communities affects the well being of children and families within these communities. South Asian community can take a unique leadership role in confronting this challenge.

You can volunteer to help victims of domestic violence and support the organizations in need. Most importantly, raising awareness about domestic violence in our community. By discussing the issue with our families, friends, and religious leaders, we can make it clear that domestic violence is never acceptable. We encourage the Hindu community to join us in confronting this issue and break the silence about this disturbing problem. Victims, regardless of their immigrant status, religious preference, or socio-economic class have the right to live free of domestic violence and be treated with respect.

In 2001 ,the Legal Aid Society of Greater Cincinnati formed the Alliance of Battered and Abused International Women, now called the <u>Alliance for Immigrant Women</u> for women facing domestic violence issues. YWCA provides safe protective shelter and necessary supportive services for battered women and their children to move them toward self-sufficiency, independence and freedom from abuse. It offers short and long-term support for women and their children.

The Alliance provides outreach to immigrant communities to increase awareness about domestic violence and community resources. It provides training to service providers, law enforcement, immigrant communities to serve victims of domestic violence. It plays a pivotal leadership role in raising public awareness of domestic violence issues and available resources. It provides a strong, completely confidential support of culturally appropriate referrals.

Participating organizations include Jewish, Hispanic, Catholic, Islamic communities, Police Departments, Hospitals, UC, Hamilton County Job Placement, YWCA, Shelters, Legal Departments and a lot more. Over twenty agencies have joined to develop prevention and interventional programs to ensure full access to all available help and resources.

The Alliance has emerged as a leader in Ohio in producing culturally and linguistically appropriate resource materials on domestic violence and developed a Cultural Resource Guidebook to aid service providers in assisting international victims of domestic violence. The Alliance provides training to a wide range of audiences, including service providers, law enforcement, immigrant community-based organizations, medical personnel, and many other groups that serve immigrant victims of domestic violence. It is an important issue and needs our attention. We need to reach out to community members who need our help. Volunteers will also be needed. The long term goal of the EC is to create a facility on the temple premises to enable such large functions in order to make the temple a focal point of the Hindu community activities.
- 4. Sulbha Midha will work out the details of the dance competition and present the proposal to the EC in the next EC meeting.
- 5. There will be a children's camp at the temple. It will have many activities including a kite flying competition.
- 6. Anisha Singh reported that the Religious Education Committee organized a trip to the Contemporary Arts Center for the children attending education classes at the temple.
- 7. Amita Gupta reported that preparations have been made for the 3-day event to celebrate the 13th anniversary of the temple, to be celebrated from May 21st to May 23rd.
- 8. Apart from preparing for all puja ceremonies, special attention will be paid to other items such as parking, security, cleanliness in the restrooms etc.
- 9. The Hindu temple in Dayton will celebrate their 25th anniversary from May 12th to May 14th. Our temple priest, Shri Srinath Bhattar, will represent the temple on this occasion.
- 10. The EC agreed to pay a special bonus to the priests to honor their outstanding service and hard work.
- 11. The former Maharaja of Jagannath Puri, Shri Gajapati Maharaja Dibyasinghdeo Deb, will be the guest of honor during the anniversary celebration. The EC agreed to present a plaque to him to honor him.
- 12. The EC has decided to look for ways and means of reducing the operating costs of the temple. The various proposals made in this regard are as follows.
 - a. Increase advertising rates for the back pages of Aradhana.
 - b. Aradhana should be made self-sustaining.
 - c. Discontinue publishing of membership form on the center page of Aradhana.
 - d. Raneshwar Gupta will seek new quotes for health insurance.
 - e. Krutarth Jain will get bids for geothermal solution for the temple to reduce heating and cooling costs.
 - f. Laxmi Srivastava reported that the thermostats in the temple have been locked. He also recommended getting an energy audit from Duke Energy.
- 13. Dates for the next General Body Meeting (GBM) will be decided upon before the next EC meeting. The notice for the GBM will be published in Aradhana.

AVIDYA IN ADVAITA VEDANT

Contd from page 1

Avidya is not only absence of knowledge but is also false knowledge. Knowledge is false when there is an error in one's judgment. According to Advaita Vedantins, error or false knowledge is *anirvachaniya* or indescribable, for the object of (mis) perception is neither existent (sat) nor non-existent (asat). In mistaking the rope for a snake, the snake is not non-existent because it is perceived, nor existent because it is negated when we know it is a rope. According to *anirvachaniya-khyati*, the illusion of seeing the rope as a snake arises when a defective sense-organ comes into contact with the rope making the *vrtti* or mental modification.

Now because of the operation of avidya or ignorance which revives our memory of a snake and shows similarities between our memory and the present object, we perceive a snake which lasts as long as there is the illusion. So far I have discussed the status of Avidya at an empirical level - i.e. how in our ordinary perceptual experiences we perceive " objects that exist" and "non-existent objects". I have also discussed Avidya as false knowledge which is mistaking one for the other. Now Avidya as false knowledge has a transcendental dimension, which is mistaking Brahman (Absolute) as the World, the Self (Atman) as the Jiva, Infinitude as Finitude. One as Many, etc.

At the Transcendental level, Avidya is also known as Maya. Avidya (or Maya) at the transcendental level may be characterized as Cosmic Ignorance, that is, everyone is ignorant of the Truth. False knowledge at the empirical level is individual, i.e. some people know the rope to be rope and not as a snake, and others mistake the rope for a snake. At the transcendental level, however, only the realized people know Brahman to be Brahman, but all of us mistake Brahman to be the World. We are all born in avidya, live in avidya, die in avidya and are re-born due to avidya. Was there ever a tirne when there was the primordial "Fall" from vidya to avidya? The advaitins maintain that avidya or primal ignorance is beginning less (anadi), because to search for the beginnings of avidya is itself avidya! Even if we were to postulate a time, when avidya began, it will raise more questions why what was once a state of knowledge has fallen into a state of avidya, leading us to speculate a whole range of issues. Avidya is also said to be positive, in the sense that its effects are felt on us. Thus Avidya conceals (avarana) the reality of Brahman and projects (vikshepa) the world instead. It is therefore neither being nor nonbeing and thus indescribable. The guestion now arises: What is the locus of Avidya? Advaitins generally agree that the content of avidya is Brahman, for without Brahman there is no avidya (about Brahman), just as the content of the misperception of the snake is the rope. Advaitins, however, differ concerning the locus of avidya, the "Bhamathi School" (Mandana Misra and Vacaspati Misra, etc) holding that Jiva is the locus of Avidya, whereas the Vivarana School (Suresvara, Prakasatman, etc.) holding that Brahman is the locus of Avidya. To explain: Is the locus of my mistaken perception of a rope as a snake in the rope or in me? Arguments can be given why it is the rope that is the locus of the snake for it is the rope, not a tree which I mistake to be a snake. On the other hand, it is argued that the rope is what it is, and it is because of my misperception that I have perceived the snake and it has nothing to do with the rope.

Avidya in Vedanta is not just intellectual ignorance but is the cause of human bondage. If avidya is bondage, knowledge is liberation, and therefore it is through inana or knowledge that one must encounter avidya. With the realization that one is in bondage, there arises the motivation to liberate oneself. In Advaita Vedanta, a threefold discipline is suggested as a way of realization of Brahman.

I. In the first stage, Sankara suggests four *sadhanas* (*sadhana catustaya*) (aids, practices) as a preliminary to the attainment of jnana. These are: | . *nityanityvastuviveka* (discriminating between eternal and non-eternal objects) 2. *ihamutraphalabhoga-viraga* (keeping detached from enjoyment of the consequences of the life here and hereafter), 3. *samadamadisatspmpatti* (possession of six great virtues) which are a. sama (tranquility), b. dama (temperance), c. uparati (regulation of mind and senses), d. titiksa (equanimity between opposites like pleasure and pain), e. samadana (steadfastness, concentration on Vedantic knowledge), and f. sraddha (faith in the the Works and Teachers of Vedanta), 4. *mumuksa* (yearning for liberation). II. The second stage in the journey towards Knowledge consists of a. *sravana* (Listening carefully Vedantic texts under a qualified guru,) b. *manana* (reflection) on the Vedantic teachings, and c. *nidhidhyasana* (contemplation, meditation) which transforms intellectual acceptance of Vedantic truths into practical convictions. III. In the third stage, when one hears the Vedantic maha-vakyas like tat tvam asi (That Thou Art), *Aham Brahmasmi* (I am Brahman), *Ayam Atma*

Brahma, the avidya in the meditator concerning the false dichotomy between himself and Brahman, between Brahman and the world etc; is removed. This is the integral experience (*aparokshanubhuti*) that arises with the removal of avidya, and one realizes oneself as Brahman.
