

### KAILASH MANSAROVAR : A DIVINE JOURNEY



With the blessings of our family, friends, and community from Cincinnati, Ohio, destiny came our way as we started our divine journey to Mount Kailash in Tibet. We were amongst the fortunate few who trekked to the abode of Lord Shiva and Goddess Parvati. Our journey began on August 28th from Kathmandu, Nepal. 19 Yatris, along with a crew of experienced guides from Himalayan Glacier Trekking Company, took off in a luxury bus with our packed luggage, tent equipment, and cooking logistics. Several hours into driving through curvy Himalayan roads, we arrived at the border of Nepal-Tibet, in a small village called, Tato-Pani (hot springs). Upon arrival, we discovered the Tibet immigration has closed for the day. We checked into a small hotel and headed for the Hot Springs bath that evening. Over the several days, we traveled through the high plateau of Tibet, enjoying the views, singing and laughing, eating and acclimatizing, and most importantly being with our inner selves. This forbidden land with its rugged terrain, yet with a spiritual heart, is a mysterious place on earth that showers the whole world with peace from its "roof of the world". The religious and adventurous passion took us to these spiritual heights of 19,500 feet trekking and climbing on the foothills of Mount Kailash, Tibet. On September 1st early afternoon, we arrived to the dazzling lake Mansarovar. This creation of God is among the most famous and highest fresh water lakes in the world. The shadow of clouds in the water of Mansarovar Lake appeared like gods watching over and blessing us from heaven. Here we prayed, meditated, and took a holy bath. Our 53 Kilometer Parikrama of Mount Kailash started on the cold morning of September 3rd. Some of us travelled by foot while others on horse. Today, it felt as if the heavens had opened up for us and allowed us to peek inside the world of gods and goddesses. We walked 18 kilometers through the valley guided by Holy Ganges River on our left and shadowed by Mount Kailash on our right. The feeling of today can only be experienced by one and not described...

Over the next few days, we trekked through rugged terrain up to the height of 19,500 feet Dolma-La pass which is the highest point on the parikrama. It was beautifully decorated with arrays of prayer flags. Upon arrival, we prayed and quickly started our journey downhill towards Guari Kund. Next several hours were trekked through the beautiful green valley with streams and surrounded by high snow capped mountain peaks with waterfalls. Upon arrival to our camp sites, we were greeted by our crew with hot tea and dinner. Tonight, we were the neighbor to the Lord's home. We awoke with a smile on our faces like a kid in a candy store...J Back in saddles and on foot; we started toward the completion of final day's parikrama. The laughter and joy echoed through the valley until we reached to our Toyota Land cruisers that awaited our return at the bottom of the valley. We traced our way back to Kathmandu, Nepal. Suddenly, hours before reaching Kathmandu, the sad feeling took over us as we left the spiritual land of Tibet.

What kind of a journey is this? To some it is adventure. To some it is to get away from the crowded world to escape. To some it is a religious site to visit. The journey is not only a trekker's dream, but the place where one can converse with their inner self. In a single journey to Kailash, we travelled several years ahead, experiencing the feeling of pain, struggle, and triumph together. The experience is a complete life. We experienced Kailash-Mansarovar. We celebrated Life!

Closing cycles. Not because of pride, incapacity or arrogance, but simply because that no longer fits your life. Shut the door, change the record, clean the house, shake off the dust.

I read the above and was very much impressed by the message ....I hope you will be too. Take stock of your life and move on to the NEW IMPROVED YOU....it is very much in keeping with the philosophy preached by Lord Krishna.....the past is gone....The future is yet to come. the present is here....be in the MOMENT. Let go of 2010 with grace and get ready to embrace 2011.


