

It is your own creation. **Your mind makes life a sad affair.** Since the mind has extraordinary powers, both positive and negative, you end up with extraordinary sufferings, sorrows, and grief. You are grieving over trifles and things that do not deserve grief.

The haves are unhappy with all the comforts, while the have not's are equally unhappy without those comforts. A house is up for sale. The seller wants to get rid of it. The buyer wants to own it. Both parties are happy with one deal, the same house. This phenomena is true in our relationships too. First we want each other badly and madly. The Essential Principles of Hinduism can be summarized as A-E-I-O-U-Y of H-I-N-D-U-I-S-M

Hinduism represents over 5000 years of development in the Indian sub-continent. Hindu time scale spans trillions of years. It was always there (eternal). Number of Hindus in the US is about 2.6 million and total number is over 800 million.

There is no single founder. Directly taught by God to some seekers (Example: The Bhagavadgita) and revealed indirectly to several other seekers (Example: The Vedic seers).

Primary scriptures are Vedas, Upanishads, Brahmasutra and Bhagavadgita. Secondary Scriptures are numerous; they include Ramayana, Mahabharata, Puranas, Itihasas, Dharma Sutras, etc.

The essential principles of Hinduism can be summarized as A-E-I-O-U-Y of H-I-N-D-U-I-S-M

"AnO bhadrAh kratavO yantu vishvatah" (R~g Veda): Let noble thoughts come to us from everywhere.

"Ekam sat, viprAh bahudhA vadanti" (R~g Veda): Truth is One; sages speak of it in numerous ways.

"Isha avAsyam idagam sarvam, yat kincha jagatyAm jagat, tEna tyaktEna bhunjItA, mA gridhah kasyasviddhanam" (Isha upanishad): God permeates everything in this ever changing universe; enjoy your share with detachment, don't be greedy after someone else's share (For example, we just enjoy looking at the Grand Canyon or the Himalays, without thinking that we should own it! This is enjoying life with detachment. We are at Hopi point in Grand Canyon to see sunset. Many like us are also there. Some of them may have a better spot than us. We just enjoy the sunset from whatever spot we have. We shouldn't stand there envying others, or plotting to knock them down to grab that spot! This is enjoying our share without greed or envy).

"Om iti brahma, Om itldagam sarvam" (taittireeya Upanishad): Om is God, Om is everything [Om is the wOmb of everything! Om represents our birth (spring), growth (summer), letting go (autumn/fall), and immortality (the silence of winter)].

"UddarEt Atmana AtmAnam, AtmAnam avasAdayEt, Atma Eva hi AtmanO bandhuh, Atma Eva ripuh Atmanah" (Bhagavadgita): Elevate your self by your own effort, never put your self down, (because) you are your best friend (and) you are your worst enemy [We see parallels to this in the words of Mark Twain- A man can with-stand a lot as long as he can stand-himself. Self-help is the best help. Be your friend first! The worst loneliness is not to be comfortable with yourself!].

"YopAm Ayatanam vEda, AyatanavAn bhavati" (Krishna Yajur Veda): One who realizes the sustaining power of Lord, he indeed is in good hands (Compare this to the Christian belief: If you believe that Jesus died for your sins, you will be saved).

"H" for harmony: Hinduism respects all religions and thus aspires for mutual tolerance and respect (This does not mean that all religions are same-a common misconception among many Hindus). It does not encourage hate (intolerant of intolerance!) or actively seek converts. It emphasizes conduct more than creed. It has the capacity to assimilate all the faiths and the Philosophies.

"I" for Incarnation (Avataar): God descends to Earth in any form and under any sky as may be needed to uphold DHARMA (righteousness). There is no space, time, form or limitations to an avataar.

"N" for nonviolence (Ahimsa). Hinduism recognizes that life supports life. One should avoid causing unnecessary injury (in thoughts, words or deeds) to one-self or other fellow beings including all life forms. Some Hindu sects stress vegetarianism, but on the whole it is not a prerequisite to be a Hindu. Attitude of gratitude (to Almighty) with which we take food is more important!

"D" for Dharma (righteousness). Always support what is right). This is a necessity: Dharma is the basis of harmonious life. If we don't support Dharma, it is as if like chopping branches of the tree (of life) we are taking shade under.

"U" for Unity of existence. Everything and all beings are inter connected and are essentially the manifestation or extension of the one Supreme Being (God). The world is one big family.

"I" for Inherent Value. God is Omnipresent & Omnipotent. Both the manifest & the un-manifest are a projection of God. They are supported, directed & controlled by God as well. The God can be worshipped in any 'Form' or 'No Form'. Just as the Flag is a symbol of a Nation, an Idol for the Hindu is symbolic of the God. A Hindu worships the God enshrined in the idol.

"S" for Supreme Reality (Brahman, another name for God; not to be confused with Brahma or Brahmin). Supreme Reality is both formless and with form, impersonal and personal, transcendent and immanent. The Supreme Reality is known by many names.

"M" for Moksha & Mantra. Dharma (Virtue), Artha (Material prosperity), Kama (pleasures) & Moksha (liberation from cycles of birth & death) are the goals of life. The secondary objectives (Artha & Kama) are sandwiched between the primary objectives of (Dharma & Moksha). Adherence to swadharma [one's own inherent talents ,attitudes & aptitudes] in achieving these goals is suggested. Moksha is the ultimate goal of Hindu life. There are numerous paths and innumerable opportunities. It can happen by one way or the other and in one life or the other. The various paths for Moksha include: karma yoga-selfless good deeds; gnaana yoga-knowledge of God; bhakti Yoga-faith or devotion; prapatti (sharNaagati) yoga-total surrender; raaja yoga-control of body, mind and intellect; mantra Yoga-union with God through repetition of a Mantra, etc. Mantra is a sacred word or a verse used for prayer. The most sacred Mantra of Hinduism is Aum/Om.

"sarvE bhavantu suKhinah sarvE santu niraamayaah" (May all be happy, may all be healthy).

"sarvE bhadraaNi pashyantu ma-kashchit dhuhkha-bhaag bhavEt" (May all prosper, may none suffer).

Minutes:

Four new carpets (\$200 each) will be acquired as we often run into a shortage of carpets for larger programs. Additional 50 chairs will be acquired for upstairs as many of the attendees are handicapped.

There need to be very clear set of instructions and guidelines for use of kitchen. Krutarth Jain and Laxmi Srivastava will develop the instructions and signboards for display in the kitchen.

Another gas line in the kitchen may also be considered for safer operation in the kitchen.

Shiv Sharma will look into the consumption of paper products since it has doubled over last year.

The temple has received a technical approval for the Barg Salt Road entrance from Clermont County. Approval is still needed from the Union Township.

An advisory board of past presidents will be constituted to make recommendations on various issues such as financial, legal, and immigration as many issues have a long history and need past perspective. There are a total of 7 past presidents.

Common contact phone numbers and calling trees will be determined in order to respond to emergencies.

Deepak Dixit will investigate use of web based email and document management. This will make the record keeping more secure. Deepak Dixit will investigate it.

The executive committee appreciated the hard work done by the cultural committee for conducting a very successful event "Naach-Sitare." The committee is considering making this an annual event. The committee will also ensure that this event does not interfere with other major temple events such as the annual mela.

Amar Sharma will function as the treasurer during the absence of Prasad Megada who will be visiting India from Oct 17th to mid-December.

The Pooja committee will acquire sweets for up to \$2,000 for Diwali. Sponsorship for this will solicited by the Pooja committee.

Essence of Hinduism

There is no shortage of quantity when we think of the Hindu scriptures. Whatever remaining of the Vedas itself is voluminous far beyond any other scripture of the world. Just to give an example, chanting of one branch (Taittiriya shAkha) of one Veda (Krishna Yajur Veda), non stop, at the speed of arrow shot from a bow, takes 38 hours! Mahabharata epic alone is 15 times longer than the Bible! Add to that Valmiki Ramayana, Jaimini Ramayana, Adhyatma Ramayana, 18 Puranas, 6 darshanas, 108 Upanishads and not even thinking of mile long commentaries in Sanskrit by revered Acharyas for every line! We haven't even considered works of latter day saints in numerous regional languages including Sanskrit! We also have whole set of sect-specific scriptures. It takes a whole life time just to study the texts of Alvars, Ramanuja and Vedanta Deshika for Vdakalai Iyengars sects, who probably constitute less than 1% of Hindus! It is simply mind boggling. However, it was summarized in 2 lines by Vyasa (son of sage Parashara and fisher girl Matsyagandha. He is the most prolific author and editor of the Hindu scriptures; Vyasa organized the Vedas; author of Brahma sutras, Mahabharata, and the Puranas). After compiling literally millions of lines in chaste Sanskrit, Vyasa summarized his knowledge of Sanatana Dharma in 2 simple lines and said in 2 simpler lines that he has done so!

shIO-kA-rdhE-na pra-va-kSHyA-mi

ya-du-ktam gra-ntha kO-Ti-bhih






