DHARMA AND SOCIETY

S. S. Rama Rao Pappu , Professor of Philosophy and Comparative Religion, Miami University

An important problem in social philosophy concerns the foundations of a society. What is society? What makes a society a 'society' and not a random group of individuals? What is it that binds individuals and makes them a society? How strong is the bond that ties the individuals together? Is there a foundation to society? Society, it is clear, is not a random group of individuals. What turns random individuals into a society is a bundle of rules which provide for roles, rights and responsibilities. The rules themselves are either original or derivative, and it is the original or primordial rules which provide the foundations of society. What distinguishes the derivative rules from the foundational rules is that the derivative rules are changeable, but the foundational rules (or a Rule in some cases) must remain constant

In the Indian tradition, dharma constitutes the foundation of a society. What is dharma? Dharma is a rich and complex concept. It means law, custom, morality, obligation, virtue, etc. What is common to all these meanings is its *normative* character. The normativity of dharma means not only its "oughtness" but also its "is-ness". In other words, dharma is both prescriptive and descriptive. In the case of laws of nature dharma is descriptive. (Sometimes, however in Indian literature, will and intention is attributed to the behavior of nature and non-human animals). For human beings, however, dharma is both descriptive and prescriptive. In the *Bhagavad Gita*, for example, Sri Krishna advises Arjuna that he *ought* to fight the war (Arjuna's *svadharma*) because it is his nature as a Kshatriya (*svabhava*) to do so.

Dharma comes from the root *dhr* which means "to hold" "to bind". Dharma binds or cements everything. It binds together individuals into *jatis*, *varnas* and the larger society, thus transforming the many into the one. How can random individuals be bound into a society? Conventionalists and social contract theorists argue that life for solitary individuals in the "state of nature" is "nasty, brutish and short" and in order to protect their life and limb they enter into a social contract with a sovereign, surrendering their rights in exchange for the security and protection which the Sovereign affords. Other social philosophers depict the original situation differently and argue that it is their self-interest which drives them to form a society. In any case, according to the conventionalists, society is a construct which came into existence due to deliberate option.

The Indian theory of Dharma (and Li and Natural Law too, as we shall examine soon) considers society as "natural". According to the dharma theory, dharma binds us because we are, by nature (*svabhava*) dharmic beings. Dharma-nature is inseparable from human nature (and other creatures and nature too). Dharma is eternal. There never was a time when dharma was not, and when dharma declines, the world is destroyed and a new world of dharma is created according to the Yuga theory. In other words, the world we live in is not so much a world of dharma and a world of no-dharma, but a world of dharma and a world of declining dharma.

To be, is to exist dharmically. What is it to live dharmically? To live dharmically involves (a) to know one's own nature (*svabhava*), (b) to know one's station in life (one's *ashrama*, one's *varna*, etc. etc) and ©to find out and discharge one's obligations conscientiously. Dharma imposes a variety of obligations - religious, moral, customary, legal etc. It should however be noted that Indian thought did not quite distinguish between different *kinds* of obligations like "legal" and "moral," "customary," etc. They are all one and the same, that is to say, that which is legal is also moral which is also religious etc. Discharging a bundle of obligations at every stage of life seems very burdensome, but it is not so burdensome if we remember that what we ought to do is what we will ordinarily do anyway, if only we realize what our true nature is.

If dharma binds everything, nature and human society, what is it that binds dharma? Nothing binds dharma. It is autonomous. Though in Vedic thought Varuna is said to be the "guardian of *Rta* (*rtadhyaksha*)", he is not the creator of *Rta*. He only protects it, viz. sees to it that no one is even tempted to violate it.

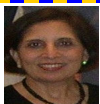

Minutes:

The EC approved a plan by the Association of Indian Physicians (AIP) to host a luncheon at the temple to create awareness on Hepatitis B. In addition, it was also proposed to involve the AIP to conduct wellness camps in the temple. A schedule for such camps will be worked out with the AIP by Kiran Dayal.

The EC agreed that the temple needs to look into cross-training the priests into providing religious services from different regions. A lot of effort has already gone into such cross-training and it will continue in the future.

The EC has decided that food will not be served until the programs conclude. Otherwise, it results in a lot of chaos and confusion as well as proves to be counter-productive to the conduct of the programs.

Specific guidelines will be issued for this year's Naach-Sitare competition to select appropriate songs and dances bearing relevance to the Hindu religion and culture. Also, the committee will also draw up specific timetable and enforce it in order to start and end the program in time.

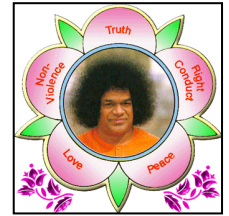

Bhagawan Sathya Sai Baba



Bhagawan Sathya Sai Baba was born on November 23, 1926, in Puttaparthi, a remote village in the state of Andhra Pradesh in Southern India. Bhagawan chose to leave his physical form on April 24, 2011. Sri Sathya Sai Baba's devotees are spread all over the world in more than 160 countries. However, He made only one foreign trip from India and that was to East Africa in 1968. Here are some of His sayings:

My Life Is My Message: "You can observe Me and My activities; note how I adhere to righteousness, moral order, truth, and universal compassion. That is what I desire you to learn from Me. ... My Life is My Message."

On His Mission: "To bring about the spiritual regeneration of humanity by demonstrating and teaching the highest principles of Truth, Right Conduct, Peace, Love and Nonviolence". "I have come to light the lamp of love in your hearts, to see that it shines day by day with added luster. I have come to tell you of this universal unitary faith, this path of Love". "I have come not to disturb or destroy any faith, but to confirm each in his own faith, so that the Christian become a better Christian, The Muslim a better Muslim, and the Hindu a better Hindu".

On Man's Mission: "Man will realize his mission on earth when he knows himself as Divine and reveres others as Divine".

On the Nature of God: "From the Form to the Formless, from the Formless to the Form - both processes are possible and progressive. The personal God is an expression, a symbol, a representation of the impersonal God. The impersonal does become personal and assumes form and attributes. This is the very nature of the Divine." **On God, the Indweller:** "Believe firmly that the body is the residence of God, that the food you eat is the offering you make to your Deity; that the bath you take is the ceremonial bathing of the Divine Spirit is you; the ground you walk upon is His domain; the joy you derive is His gift; the grief you experience is His lesson that you tread the path more carefully. Remember Him ever, in sun and shade, day and night, awake or sleep." "God is in you. God is in every word of yours, every deed and thought. So, speak, do and think as befits Him". "God is neither distant, nor distinct from you." What is meant by the phrase "To know God?" It means "To love God."

On God and Love: "God is Love, Live in Love". "The mind sees separateness. Love sees unity". "Unity leads to Purity; Purity leads to Divinity". "The end of knowledge is love. The end of education is character". "Love in thought is Truth; Love in action is Right Conduct; Love in understanding is Peace; Love in feeling is Nonviolence." "Love All, Serve All," "Help Ever, Hurt Never." **On Service:** "Of all righteous acts, help rendered to those needing it, is the most righteous". "Service springs out of Love and it scatters Love in profusion". "Serve man until you see God in all men". **On Spirituality:** "Spirituality is an activity; it is an activity of the Divinity within". "Service is a spiritual discipline, not the past time of the rich and well placed." "The mind is a bundle of desires...remove the threads of attachment one by one; at the end the 'cloth' disappears and the mind is clear and pure".

On Education: "True education is not for a mere living, but for a fuller and more meaningful life". "What is the unmistakable mark of a wise man? It is love, love for all humanity".

"Knowledge without devotion to God produces hatred". **On Peace:** "**I -Want—Peace.** 'I' is ego. 'Want' is desire. Remove ego and desire and you will have peace". "Mankind can find happiness only in unity, not in diversity". "If there is righteousness in the heart, there will be beauty in character. If there is beauty in character, there will be harmony in the home. When there is harmony in the home, there will be order in the nation. When there is order in the nation, there will be peace in the world."

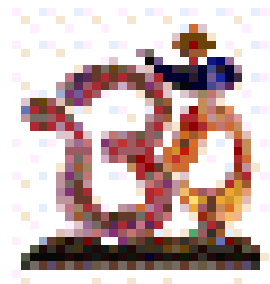

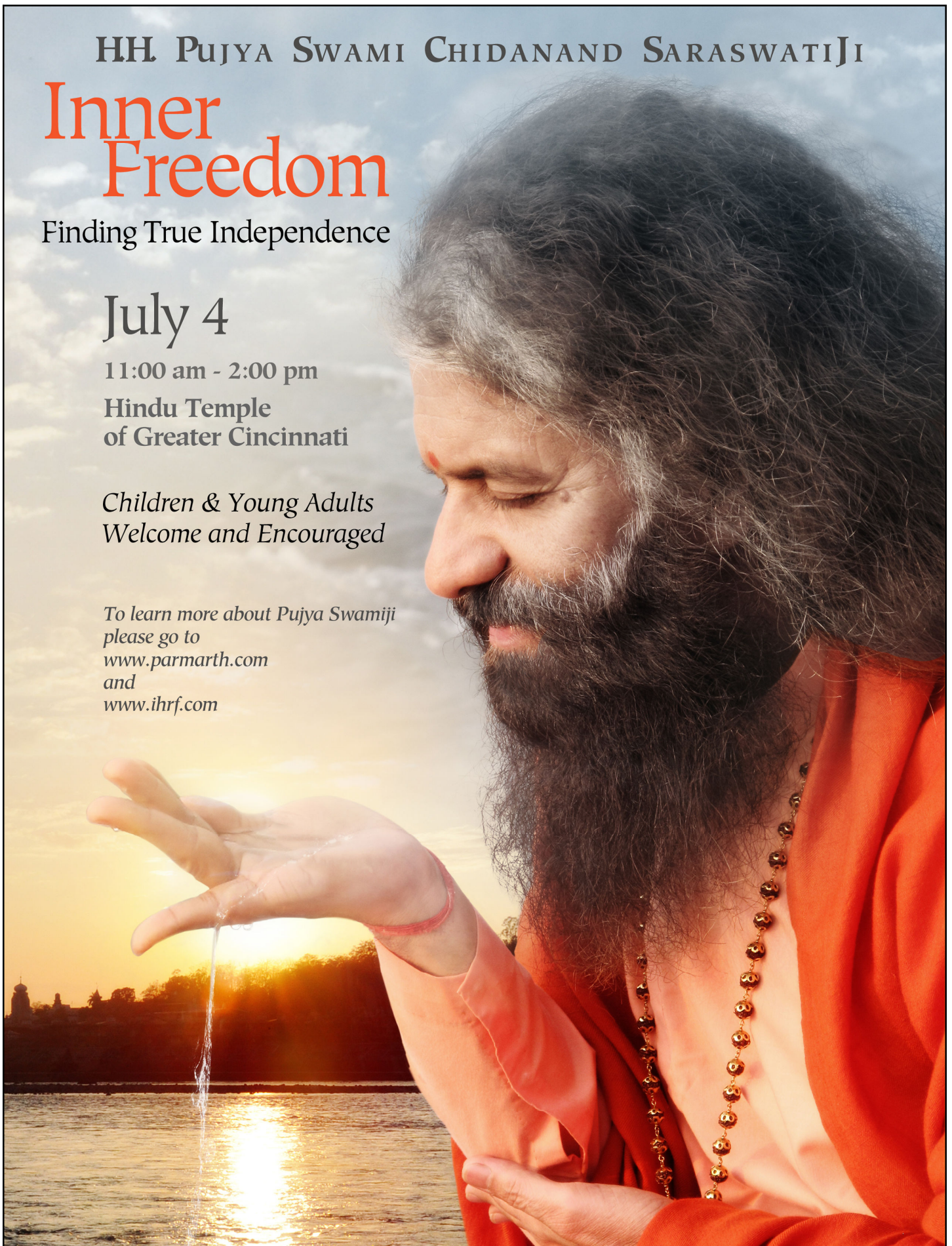

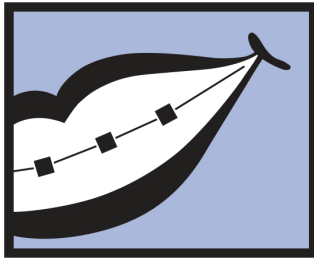
