



Ratha Yatra Celebration July 2, 2011





Krishna Janmashtami

This whole universe including human form is nothing but the manifestation of three gunas (sat, raj and tam) of 'nature' also known as 'Prakriti' that acts under the perfect laws of supreme 'Brahm'. 'Brahm' has infinite attributes and power. "Brahm' is different from 'Brahma'. 'Brahm' in 'Sat-gun' is considered as 'Vishnu' (sustainer), in 'Raj-gun' as 'Brahma' (creator) and in 'Tam-gun' as 'Shiva' (destroyer). 'Brahm' is eternal. So, Brahma, Vishnu and Shiva are also eternal and worshipped by all the Hindus. Since Vishnu is the 'sustainer' of the universe, Hindus believe that he incarnates himself in different Yugas in different forms to sustain the values and virtues of 'Dharma' and destroy 'Adharma'. Sant Tulsidas wrote in 'Sri Ramcharitmanas'

Jab jab hoi dharam kai hani, barhahin asur adham abhimani!

Tab tab prabhu dhari vividh shareera, harahi kripanidhi sajjan peera!!

Whenever righteousness declines and number of arrogant demons increases, at that time supreme God, assuming various divine bodies, incarnates himself on this earth to remove sufferings of the virtuous men.

We all know that Vishnu descended as Bhagwan Ram in Treta-yug (more than 864,000 years ago) and established righteousness by killing many demons and finally 'Ravan' the most powerful demon of that period. He became an ideal example for the society and taught the lesson of right behavior and established the values of 'Dharma'. Similarly, Hindus believe that Lord Vishnu at the end of 'Dwapar-yuga' manifested himself as 'Lord Krishna' more than 5,000 years ago. In Srimad Bhagwadgita, Lord Krishna declares:

yada yada hi dharmasya, glanir bhavati bharata!

abhyutthanam adharmasya, tadatmanam srjamy aham!!

Whenever and wherever there is extreme decline in pious and religious activities and rise of irreligious activities predominates, I incarnate myself.

This was again the period of disappearance of true religion and predominance of irreligious activities. The earth was suffering with the atrocities of his maternal uncle, Kansa. It was the eighth day (Ashtami) of Sravana (the month of Bhadrapada Krishna-paksha) and presence of a very auspicious 'Rohini nakshatra' (star) when Lord Krishna descended on a densely dark and heavily rainy night to end the rule and atrocities of his maternal uncle, Kansa. Most of us have read and know the story of 'Krishn-Janma' in Kansa's prison in Mathura and his 'Baal-Lilas' starting from Gokul and killing many demons from the very childhood including 'Kansa'. The birth of Lord Krishna is in itself a transcendental phenomenon that overwhelms everybody with its supra mundane happenings.

Hindus celebrate 'Krishn-Janmashtami' with full joy. Some devotees fast for the whole day and break it at midnight after the Krishn-Janma. The festivities in temples all over the world begin in the late evening with bhajans, keertan, and reaches to its peak at midnight when Sri Krishna descends. The priests blow Conch, devotees dance in joy chanting various hymns and rocking the cradle of Sri Krishna with love. The idol of lord is bathed with Panchamrit (milk, ghee, oil, honey and Ganga-jal) by the temple priests and is distributed as Prasad to the devotees along with other sweets.

It's a festival of joy and celebration. Being a Hindu, it's our responsibility to follow the path of dharma and religion. We should remember that this Human life is achieved by our unaccountable good karma. In this human form, we have been given divine virtues and we should not forget our purpose of this life that is 'self-realization'. Lord Krishna declares in Chapter 4, Shloka 9 of Srimad Bhagwadgita:

janma karma ca me divyam evam yo vetti tattvatah!

tyaktva deham punar janma naiti mam eti so 'rjuna!!

6 O' Arjuna, one who knows the transcendental nature of my appearance and activities does not, upon leaving the body, take his birth again in this material world, but attains my eternal abode.

What a great declaration with full confidence? Only supreme 'Brahm' can make such declaration to human beings and only that individual who has attained 'self-realization' can experience the transcendental nature of Gods appearance. Lord Krishna shared love amongst all and bestowed the knowledge of Karma, Gyan and Bhakti-Yog and the path of 'self realization.' We all should follow the path of righteousness and dharma and preachings of Sri Krishna in Srimad Bhagwadgita.

BE A PART OF THE TEMPLE HISTORY: ADOPT A PART OF THE NEW ROAD

Good news, we finally got the permit to build a road from the Barg Salt Road gate to the temple parking lot. First, it will help to give us a better access to the temple providing an access from a bigger two lane road. No more worries on how to pass on Klatte Road when two cars are coming. Second, most important is that it will give us a good chance to develop other projects such as retirement homes, Religious Cultural and Educational Center. This center will have a main hall to provide enough space for big functions like Navaratri Festival, Musical Concerts and Religious National conferences. The proposed road has been divided into 20 equal parts. Each part will be identified by a light pole bearing the name of the family, any deity name or any organization name etc.

Guide Lines on How to Adopt the Road

Anyone who is interested in adopting the road must pay at least \$15,000 (fifteen thousands) by August 30th, 2011

Balance \$20,000 by Oct 30th, 2011.

Selection of the road (numbered 1 thru 20) will be on first come first basis.

Gandhi Food Drive: 1988-2010

A Message of Farewell and Appreciation from Y. Datta

After living in Cincinnati since 1974, we have now decided to move permanently to Florida sometimes in September. So, it is with a great sense of sadness and nostalgia, that I am writing this open letter to the Indian community of Greater Cincinnati. Starting with the current year 2011, I will no longer be able to run the Gandhi Food Drive (GFD). However, I am very happy to say that Vinay Kumar, who has been associated with the GFD from its very

inception, has very graciously agreed to keep the GFD going.

In 1988 Dr. J.K. Bhattacharjee and I started the Gandhi Food Drive. It was Janki Venkayya, a leading social activist in the Dayton area, who provided the inspiration for this project. Our first drive began in the old Hindu Temple on M.L. King Drive. Starting with the year 2000 we added another source of cash: corporate-sponsored donations to the United Way program. It is important to emphasize that our donations have come almost exclusively from members of the Indian community. Over the 23 year-period 1988-2010 we collected over \$145,000. A yearly summary of our receipts appears at the end of this message.

The GFD and I owe a debt of gratitude to many individuals and institutions. First, and foremost, is my co-founder, Dr. Bhattacharjee, who has been a pillar of strength for the GFD. Second, I can't say enough about the heroic efforts of Vimala Majeti, who pulled in close to \$5,700. Third, I am very thankful to Usha Gandhi, Vinay Kumar, and Rohini Venkatesh—GFD coordinators—who collected a lot of food and/or cash over these years. Fourth, there are numerous individuals who acted as volunteers to bring in donations for the GFD. Fifth, special thanks for *Agrani*, the Bengali society: the only Indian social group that has made a significant contribution year after year. Sixth, I am grateful to all the individual donors for their generous contribution. Finally, last, but not the least, is the institutional support provided by the Hindu Society of Greater Cincinnati: the Hindu Temple has virtually been a "home" for the GFD for so many years.

The entire proceeds of our collection were handed over yearly to the 40-year old *Freestore Foodbank*. It is the largest emergency food and services provider to the poor and the needy in the Tri-State area serving 20 counties in Ohio, Kentucky and Indiana, distributing over 12 million pounds of food annually.

Mondays, or Somvar, in the month of Shravan (July - August)

This period is considered highly auspicious for praying to Lord Shiva. It is believed that the worship of Shiva during Shrawan month is 108 times more powerful than worshipping during normal days. Millions of devout Hindus observe the Shravan Somwar Vrat – fasting and performing Pujas on Mondays in Sawan Month. It is believed that those who observe Somwar vrat will have their desires fulfilled and will be blessed with wisdom.

Here is a brief procedure to observe Shravan Somvar Vrat

After the morning bath and other purification rituals.

- Lord Ganesha is first prayed to.
- Next, Lord Shiva is prayed to by chanting Om Namah Shivaya.
- The offerings that are made are Bilva leaves, white flowers, water, honey and milk.
- If you have Shivling at home you can do abhishek with water, honey or milk.
- Fasting on the day is from sunrise to sunset.

You can chant Maha Mritunjaya Mantra or Om Namah Shivaya on the day.

- Those who observe fast on Mondays in some regions wear only white clothes.
- Those observe partial fast eat fruits.
- Some devotees read the Shiva Purana on the day.
- Those people who live along the banks of Ganga use water from Ganga to perform abhishek on the Shivling.
- The fast is broken in the evening after praying to Lord Shiva. Some devotees visit a Shiva Shrine during the period. Some devotees opt for a 24-hour fast and they break the fast on the next day morning. In some areas, fasting on Mondays is observed by unmarried women to get a good husband. It must be noted that Monday is dedicated to Lord Shiva and there are devout Hindus who observe vrat on all Mondays in a year.

"Jana Gana Mana" The National Anthem of India

India will celebrate her 64th independence anniversary from British rule on August 15th, 2011. On this morning, we will look proudly towards the tri color, flying with all its glory on the Red Fort, official buildings, in schools, and homes in India. We will sing our national anthem "Jana Gana Mana" with heart full of joy and pride. The tri color will not only fly in the skies of the India's soil but also in all nations of the world which people of the Indian origin call their second home.

On this proud occasion, I would like to remember Sri Rabindranath Tagore, the great poet and noble laureate who is the lyricist and composer of "Jana Gana Mana". It was sung for the first time in Kolkata (Calcultta) on December 22nd, 1911 in the assembly of Indian National Congress. On Jan 24th, 1950, the government of India adopted it as the national anthem. Sri Tagore is the only poet in the world who has written and composed the national anthem for two nations: India and Bangladesh. The national anthem of Bangladesh "Amar Sonar Bangla" was adopted as the national anthem of Bangladesh in 1972 after its independence from Pakistan.

Sri Rabindranath Tagore, also known as Gurudev, was born in a prominent Bengali family on May 7^{th} , 1861 in Jorasankao, Kolkata. He was the first Asian Indian Scholar to receive the Nobel Prize for literature in 1913 for his book of poems, *Gitanjali*, which contains highly spiritual poems, translated into English by Gurudev himself. He was awarded knighthood by the British crown, which he returned in protest to The Jalianwala Bagh incidence, where over hundreds of unarmed Indian freedom fighters were massacred by British army.

Gurudev's contribution to the literary world in the form of art, paintings, essays, songs, dramas, poems, short stories, and novels is enormous. He wrote over 2,000 poems, collectively known as Rabindranath Sangeet. His poems are sung in every household in the state of West Bengal and are an integral part of Bengali culture.

Vishva Bharati University, Shantiniketan, India was founded by Sri Rabindranath Tagore in 1921 with the primary aim to find unity in our diverse and rich culture via literature, art, and music. He wanted to promote world peace through friendship and brotherhood. The present chancellor of Vishva Bharati University is the Prime Minister of India, Sri Manmohan Singh. Some of the renowned alumni are former Prime Minister Indira Gandhi, Amratya Sen (Noble Laureate in Economics), Satyajit Ray (Filmmaker/Writer), Mahashweta Devi (Writer), Gaytri Devi (Maharani of Jaipur) and many more prominent figures.

This year marks his 150th anniversary and all over the world people are taking this opportunity to celebrate and remember the rich inheritance he has left behind.

I want to leave you with one of his beautiful verses from Gitanjali: "I have got my leave. Bid me farewell, my brothers I bow to you all and take my departure. Here I give back the keys to my door-and I give up all claims to my house. I only ask for last kind words from you. We were neighbors for long, but I received more than I could give. Now the day has dawned and the lamp that lit my dark corner is out. A summons has come and I am ready for my journey." (First Scribner Poetry Edition, 1997)

People of India shall be forever in debt to Gurudev for the rich legacy he has left behind. We should all collectively live to fulfill his dream and thus, pay our homage to the great soul, Gurudev.



A Message from the President

Dear Devotees,

I hope this message finds you all well. It's been a very exciting first half of the year. HSGC exceeded expectations on religious festivals, cultural events like *Holi* and *Naach Sitare* and in inviting guest speakers. These events were attended and appreciated in large numbers. Recently, we have added a much needed Commercial Kitchen and *Yagnashala* to meet your requirements and enhance our services. We are also on schedule to finish *Girbha Griha* (individual domes over each of the deities), a religious library/class room and site clearing for a future road to connect the temple to Barg Salt Rd. (see pg. 8 & 9). We are truly thankful for the dedication of our volunteers and donors in making this happen. Funds raised for these projects are maintained as separate accounts (see pg.18). While we are making promising progress, we have a long way to go in order to raise funds for necessary projects like elevator installation and road/parking repairs as well as many other long-term projects.

Our operating funds, which pay for day-to-day services, come from a general account (see pg. 16 & 17). Main sources of income for this fund are your general donations and donations from *puja* activities. Our expenses for the first two quarters of 2011 were \$23,450 more than our income. This is because the expenses are always higher in first half of the year. This seems alarming but compared to last two years we are following the same pattern. Normally, we break even in Autumn with the help of some of major festivals and fundraising events which occur in the second half of the year. Every year HSGC not only balances the expense but also adds to our reserve for emergency funds. This reserve also helps HSGC to stay ahead on payments of our outstanding mortgage of \$499,665.

We will be using part of the emergency fund for some urgent repair work. Our building is more than 15 years old and now we are looking at the scheduled maintenance which adds up to a significant cost. We must start reroofing at the damaged roof areas and masonry restoration to seal and clean masonry joints on exterior walls to stop water leakage. This will consume a major portion of our emergency fund. I'm sure you feel as strongly as I do – our Temple is not merely stone and mortar, but a monument to our collective faith, and an outward sign of our inner devotion. I urge all of you to continue your generous support and make an extra effort to donate openhandedly to absorb these urgent repair costs.

Minutes:

- 1. EC agreed to have the main function/s of the month published on the front page of Aradhana and also immediately after the upcoming events. So page 6-7 will provide details of the main events of the month.
- 2. Pooja committee reported that the temple anniversary event was a successful event. Over \$20K were collected during this celebration.
- 3. The Naach-Sitare program preparations were reviewed. All EC members were requested to be present for this event.
- 4. Update on temple roof Laxmi Srivastava and Krutarth Jain are working with two top contractors to get an assessment. Krutarth Jain will update the EC on the progress within a month.
- 5. Tiles update: The contractor, who did the original work, agreed to redo the work free of charge. However, the contractor has been facing too many unforeseen events leading to his lack of availability. The tiles need to be fixed before the Rath Yatra on July 2nd. Laxmi Srivastava will look at the available options.
- 6. Date for visit by Steve Chabot Two potential dates will be identified.
- 7. The EC authorized Pooja Committee to pay special dakshina to Pundit Srinivas Bhattar for officiating temple services for 2 weeks.
- 8. Update on the library Construction for the library will start on June 15th. It will complete within 15 days of the start. There will be two parts of the construction. One will consist of constructing a bathroom and the other will consist of constructing the actual space for the library. This construction will have no financial burden on the temple. The library will be functional by August 14th.
- 9. Scholarship fund: Some donors have expressed interest in establishing a scholarship to recognize talented students in the community. Ambikaipakan Balasubramaniam and Deepak Dixit will coordinate it with the prospective donors.
- 10. The EC has decided to discontinue sending birthday greeting cards sent by the temple.
- 11. Update on flowers/garland expense: A vendor has expressed interest in providing the garlands at a lower cost. However, it involves some upfront investment. The EC has asked Prasad Megada to find out the details and present findings in the next EC meeting.
- 12. Health Insurance cost: Deepak Dixit will get the details of the current cost from Jagadish Karande.
- 13. In order to keep capital expenses under control, the EC has decided that for all capital purchases, there needs to to be a prior approval by the EC.
- 14. Prasad Megada will contact Jagadish Karande to identify the details on how the housing allowance for the priests is computed and treated.


