Meeting Minutes

The mela calendars of other nearby temples will be consulted in order to avoid conflict for the vendors.

Anil Jindal and Raneshwar Gupta will be permanent members of the mela committee. The cultural secretary will be the third member of the mela committee.

The EC approved purchase of a high quality SLR camera with cost in the range of \$500-\$600 on recommendations of the temple web master, Bharat Vala. This is necessary as the current camera provides poor quality pictures for posting on the website. However, the EC asked to defer the purchase of a high-quality video camera.

Road repairs – The road inside the temple campus from the Klatte Road entrance to the temple needs repairs and repaving. This work is estimated at \$28,500. Raneshwar Gupta informed the EC that he will commence this work soon and that it will not cost the temple any additional monies from the general fund beyond what has already been provided for this purpose. (Raneshwar ji – what is the current balance in this account?)

GRAND CELEBRATION OF MAJESTIC GARBHAGRIHAS INSTALLATION







The devotees of the Hindu Temple of greater Cincinnati, Ohio, recently accomplished another highly ambitious milestone, installation of meticulously crafted and breathtakingly beautiful gold plated Garbhagrihas (innermost sanctrum where resides each deity) for each of 16 deities. Individually crafted emblem of each deity on gold plated Garbhagrihas with two angels offering lotus to the deity were custom made by a team of highly specialized shilpies led by National Award winning artist Sri P.Partha Sarathy of Bangalore, India.

The grand celebration for three days, October 21-23, 2011, was attended by approximately 1500 devotees for a once in a life time of religious and cultural experiences. As soon as they stepped inside the large door of the deity floor, the devotees observed the jaw dropping, spectacular majestic view (maha darshan) of all sixteen deities with individual golden Chhatra and Garbhagriha. The attendees never experienced before and never will experience again such a memorable event.

The ceremony was performed by six learned priests led by the Temple Senior Priest Acharya Kailash Sharma. Celebration included authentic religious rituals -Puja and elaborate festivities namely Maha Ganesh Puja, Bastu Shanti Puja - Havan, Navgrah Homa. All Utsav Murthi Abhishekam, Garbhagriha Kumbhabhishekam, Suvasini Puja, Kalash Yatra, Shrarvadeva Gyatri Homa, Push Varsha, Sundarkand Path, Mata Ki Chowki, Maha Mangal Aarti, Maha Prasad among other festivities. Puja Committee members chaired by Kiran Dayal planned for months for authentic religious celebrations and enjoyment of all attendees.

This large and ambitious project chaired by Rameshwar Dayal and other committee members, Satgur Srivastava, Kiran Dayal, Raj Bodalia and Dr. Ganesh Yadiapalli, required several years of research, planning, examining model Garbhagrihas, inviting several shilpies to the Temple before selecting aesthetically appealing, correct architecture and most experienced as well as capable shilpie. Selected shillies from Bangalore visited the Tmple sevaral times in order to determine exact nature of the Garbhagriha and Chhatra for each deity. The Garbhagriha project manager Satgur Srivastava visited Bangalore many times to examine the perfect blueprint of Garbhagriha for each deity and to assure the timely progress. Finally several shilpies led by Sri Manjunath Chitrakar spent more than a month in the Cincinnati Temple completing the delicate assembly of multiple components of each Garbhagriha and installing each Garbhagriha on top of each existing deity without any physical support blocking the front view of all deities and Garbhagrihas. The result has been spectacular and beautiful beyond description.

In addition to the sixteen deities and Garbhagrihas, Cincinnati Hindu Temple enjoys several other unique or first of its kind features. The Founding members established the Temple (inaugurated in 1995) on a 100 acres of prime wooded land close to I-275 expressway with a broad vision and goal to meet the present and future religious, spiritual, cultural and educational needs (multifunctional community center, retirement homes, Hinduism library - education center, outdoor Yagna Shala Pavilion and marriage center) of our growing Hindu community in the greater Cincinnati, Tri-States region.

Twelve deities of same dimension and highest aesthetic quality (based on the principle of equality, inclusiveness and unity among diversity), custom made by highly acclaimed artists in India have been installed on the same platform in 1997. Four additional deities have been added following the Temple expansion with two wings. Temple deities include highly prominent Sri Mahavira, Sri Jagannath, Sri Srinath, Sri Chitragupta, Sri Navgrah, Sri Durga, Sri Saraswati, Sri Lakshmi, Sri Ganesg, Sri Hanuman, Sri Shiv, Sri Murgan, Sri Lakshmi-Narayana, Sri Venkateshwara, Sri Ram-Sita and Sri Radha-Krishna.

Only in our Cincinnati Temple, beautiful OM, the most sacred and primordial sound as well as most unifying symbol in Hindu religion has been established at the center of the deity platform. World renowned Master Glass Sculptor, Maestro Pino Signoretto of Murano, Italy was commissioned for the construction of the most authentic OM. This unprecedented project with much research and planning took more than two years to complete in 2000. The majestic OM is made up of special multicolor glass, 66 inches in height, 55 inches in diameter and 1500 pound in weight. The small lighted symbols inside the OM represent different stages of human life cycle according to Vedic scripture and three physical parts symbolize sun, moon and earth. OM is a major attraction along with Garbhagrihas for devotees and visitors to the Temple. Both are "teaching moments" about our rich religious and cultural heritage for children and visitors.

The Temple also recently inaugurated the out door Yagna Shala Pavilion - Hindu marriage center and the Library of Hinduism . The long shaded Temple boulevard inside the Temple ground is used for Rathyatra for Sri Jagannath , Kalash Yatra and other religious procession .

But God has many attributes and many functions. In order to understand "God" fully and completely, our dharma gives mankind freedom to worship Him in diverse forms.

Thus Hindus worship same one "God" as in formless, as well as in different Forms (Eshwara or Bhagwaan), in nature, in Devtas or even in human forms (Like Guru or Parents)

Concept of Trinity (Tridev)

Vishnu Preserver (who takes care of all of us)

Shiva Destroyer of evil (who protects the world and destroy evil power)

Bhagwaan or Ishwar

When we worship God in forms, they are called Bhagwaan or Ishwar. You can call them personalized Gods also that mean you have personal relations with God. They are Bhagwaan Ram, Bhagwaan Krishna, Hanuman ji, Sarsawati ji, Vishnu ji, Shiv ji or Durga ji etc.

Dewtaas:

Hindus consider nature also part of the same great one "God", supreme power and worship them . Hindus worship rivers, trees, mountains, lakes etc.



Meeting Minutes - October 2, 2011

Present: Krutarth Jain(President), Ambikaipakan Balasubramaniam (Vice President), Deepak Dixit (Secretary), Prasad Megada (Treasurer), Kiran Dayal (Pooja Committee), Laxmi Srivastava (Long Range Planning), Asit Saha (Cultural Committee), Anisha Singh (Religious Education Committee), Raneshwar Gupta (Fundraising Committee), Geeta Mehan (Editor-Aradhana)

Absent: Dilip Patel (Maintenance Committee)

Minutes:

Head Priest Appointment: The executive committee approved the appointment of Pundit Kailash Sharma as the head priest of the temple in recognition of his outstanding services to the temple over last 15 years.

The executive committee approved conducting Yoga classes in the temple by a qualified Yoga instructor, Dr. Shantala Gangatirkar. She will conduct the classes as a temple volunteer. The start date, timing, and fees for the class will be determined subsequently.

The executive committee approved the project to develop a new garden in the center circle in front of the temple. This project will be funded through donations by Dr. Premanand Nayak and Dr. R.N. Shenai.

The executive committee approved the temple technology initiative. This will involve creation of a new temple website as well as web-based document management. HSGC will seek a new domain name for the website "CincinnatiTemple.org" to reflect our status as a religious organization.

The treasured presented temple income and expenses. The income and expenses of the temple are evenly matched as of September, 2011. Details will be published in Aradhana.

The treasurer, Prasad Megada, will be away for 3 months. His alternates, Amar Sharma or Raj Bodalia, will provide treasurer's reports in his absence.

Update from the Hindu Mandir Executive Conference 2011

The annual conference was held in Columbus, OH this year

HSGC was represented by Krutarth Jain, Deepak Dixit, and Anisha Singh

The key takeaways, based on presentations by 118 temples participating, are as follows:

The temples are evolving as spiritual, religious educational, social, and cultural organizations, apart from providing the traditional functions of conducting pooja / rituals

The temples are placing emphasis on seva, bhakti, and gyan

There is a tremendous need to involve second and third generation Hindus in temple management and activities

Children's education programs are significantly more successful than our temple. We need to work aggressively to increase participation in temple provided education programs.

Status of the tiles project: Delivery of the new tiles was delayed due to production issues at the manufacturer. Now the tiles have been delivered. The tiles are being installed right now.

Education material: Indian heritage class material will be given by Anisha Singh for publishing on the temple website.

Lower level maintenance - Three rooms are being readied in order to use these rooms for various purposes including educational purposes, guest spaces for visiting priests, as well as an emergency room.

Academic scholarships- Dr. Ghia is sponsoring scholarships through the temple. The EC will ask Dr. J. K. Bhattacharya and Dr. Raj Bhatnagar and a representative from the Ankur Gujrati Samaj to develop a process for evaluation and award of the scholarship. (Has anyone talked to them yet?)

Printer bids – The bids from different printers were evaluated. It was recommended to the EC by the Krutarth Jain and Geeta Mehan that the differences between two leading bids were minor. Considering our longstanding relationship with the current printer, MDI, that we retain the services for MDI. The EC approved this recommendation.

The pooja committee expressed reservations about the title of "Adjunct Priest" for Dr. Koti Srikrishna. Two members of the EC, Krutarth Jain and Deepak Dixit, will meet with the pooja committee to understand their reservations and work on an appropriate title for Dr. Koti Srikrishna in recognition of his proposed services to the temple. Kiran Dayal will organize the meeting with the pooja committee to find an appropriate solution. However, the final decision will rest with the EC.


Building maintenance update – Krutarth Jain reported that the first step in masonry restoration work, the power wash, started on 10/2/2011. All restoration work will take place on the exterior side of the temple and will not impact any ceremonies or services inside the temple. The work is progressing as per schedule.

Elections for year 2012 – The election commission will be constituted for conducting the elections for executive committee for year 2012. The roles and responsibilities of the election commissioners as well as the election schedule will be published in upcoming issues of Aradhana. All positions in the EC are open for re-election. It was clarified to all EC positions are valid for a term of one year only.

Mela update – The annual mela was canceled this year. The decision to cancel the event was taken due to multiple factors. The long-standing chair for the mela event, Anil Jindal, was not available to organize the event due to personal reasons. The EC members assigned with this responsibility were stretched thin due to several other commitments. This resulted in very low participation of vendors and cultural program participants. The EC has taken the following decisions for next year.

The EC has received commitment from Anil Jindal that he will organize the mela next year.

The date for the mela will be published on next year's calendar. It will most likely be held in 1st week of September of 2012.


