Koti Sreekrishna, PhD studied biochemistry and is currently a senior scientist in the Global Biotechnology division at the Procter & Gamble Company. His interests include philosophy, interreligious dialogue, public speaking (Toastmaster since 1985 and is a DTM), and studying the Hindu scriptures. He has been teaching Hinduism 101 to World Religion Class at Mount St. Joseph University and at local schools and Churches since 1997. He has previously (April 2006) authored a translation of the *Purusha Suktam*, a Hindu creation theme and has recently co-authored "The New Bhagavad-Gita: Time less classic in the language of our times". How to Chant Mantras: Benefits of Chanting Mantra

Mantra is a Sanskrit word derived from two words, Man (Manan) and Tra (Trana). Trana means liberation from the worldly ties. Originally originated in the Vedic tradition of India, mantras later become an integral part of the Hindu traditions and later a practice followed within Buddhism, Sikhism and Jainism. Mantras are a powerful combination of words that is believed to reach the deity in the form of sound vibrations. Mantra can be used for self realization, freedom from worries, fulfilling desires, to bring success, peace and happiness. Chanting mantras is a good spiritual discipline and not a superstition.

When mantras are chanted, an appealing effect is felt in the body. Also, the combined effect of sound vibrations can be observed on brain, or on EEG (Electro Encephala Graph). Thus it is called as Music Therapy or Mantra Therapy. There are various kinds of Mantras, out of which Tantrik Mantras and Vedic Mantras are more popular. Tantrik mantras are called as Beeja Mantras and Vedic Mantras are those which are followed under the Vedic system.

Benefits of Chanting Mantras

Chanting of mantras repeatedly in rhythmic tone with ups and downs, create a melodious effect in the body. This effect can be defined as Neuro-linguistic (NLE) + Psycholinguistic effect (PLE). These effects are caused due to the production and spreading of medicinal chemicals in the brain, which give smoothening and curing effect in the body. Also, listening to mantras lowers blood pressure and normalizes heart beat rate, brain wave pattern, adrenalin level and the cholesterol level. Even the doctors advise the people under high tension to listen to music or mantras. Chanting or listening mantras has become an accepted formula like the yoga and Pranayam practices. Chanting mantras has gentle effect on nervous system and helps relax the muscles and also used to reduce stress.

What is Kalasha? Why do we worship kalasha?

Kalasha is a silver, brass, mud or copper pot filled with water. Mango leaves are placed in the mouth of the pot and a coconut is placed over it. A red or white thread is tied around its neck or sometimes all around it in an intricate diamond-shaped pattern. The pot may be decorated with designs.

Kalasha filled with water represents the gross body; when it is energized with sacred chants it becomes full with the divine life force and gains special powers. Such a Kalasha is also referred to as a sanctified *poorna kumbha*. Such a *Kalasha* is placed in all auspicious and important occasions like the traditional house warming (*grihapravesa*), wedding, worship etc. It is placed near the entrance as a sign of welcome. It is also used in a traditional manner while receiving holy persons and dignitaries.

The water in the *kalasha* symbolizes the primordial water from which the entire creation emerged. It is the giver of life to all and has the potential of creating everything there is both animate and inanimate. The leaves and coconut represent creations. The thread represents the love that "binds" all in creation. The *kalasha* is therefore considered auspicious and worshipped. The waters from all the holy rivers, the knowledge of all the Vedas and the blessings of all the deities are invoked in the *kalasha* and its water is thereafter used for all the rituals, including the abhisheka. The consecration (*kumbhaabhisheka*) of a temple is done in a grand manner with elaborate rituals including the pouring of holy water from one or more *kalashas* on the Deities and also on the *Kalasha* placed on the top of the temple.

During the churning of the cosmic ocean for *Amrita* (nectar of immortality, ambrosia), the Lord appeared bearing the pot filled with *Amrita*. Thus the *kalasha* also symbolizes immortality. Men of wisdom are full and complete as they identify with the infinite Truth (*poornatvam*). They brim with joy and love and respect all that is auspicious. We greet them with a *purnakumbha* ("full pot") acknowledging their greatness and as a sign of respectful and reverential welcome, with a "full heart".

Why do we consider the lotus as special?


The lotus blooms with the rising sun and closes up at night. Similarly, our minds should open up and expand with the light of knowledge and shun darkness. The lotus grows even in slushy ponds, yet It remains beautiful and untainted, reminding us that we too can and should strive to remain pure and beautiful within, under all circumstances. The lotus leaf never gets wet even though it is always in water. It symbolizes the man of wisdom (*gyaani*) who remains ever joyous, unaffected by the world of sorrow and change.

ब्रह्मण्याधाय कर्माणि (brahmaṇyādhāya karmā□i) सङ्गं त्यक्त्वा करोति यः (sa□ga□ tyaktvā karoti ya□) ∣लिप्यते न स पापेन (lipyate na sa pāpena) पद्मपत्रमिवाम्भसा (padmapatramivāmbhasā | Bhagavad-gītā 5:10|

[Just as water doesn't stick to a lotus leaf, sin doesn't stick to a person who works unattached and dedicates the work to the supreme]. In other words, One who works without selfish motives and has true humility has a lesser chance of committing sin.

Our bodies have certain energy centers described in the Yoga Shaastras as chakras. Each one is associated with lotus that has a certain number of petals. For example, a lotus with a thousand petals represents the Sahasra chakra at the top of the head, which opens when the yogi attains Godhood or Realisation. Also, the lotus posture (padmaasana) is recommended when one sits for meditation. A lotus emerged from the navel of Lord Vishnu. Lord Brahma originated from it to create the world. Hence, the lotus symbolizes the link between the creator and the supreme Cause. It also symbolizes Brahmaloka, the abode of Lord Brahma.

The purpose of the Library of Hinduism is to provide information, support and religious education to the Greater Cincinnati Hindu diaspora by providing them with scholarly books, internet resources, Videos and CDs; organize "miniconferences," Seminars and Lectures on the Hindu heritage and tradition; offer

an intensive "Certificate Course" in Hinduism, etc.

Work on the Library of Hinduism project began on July 4, 2011, with the blessings of and ground-breaking ceremony by Swami Chidananda Saraswati, Parmarth Niketan, Rishikesh. The Library development was phased in three stages –(a) construction of two rooms in the lower level of the Temple, one for the Library and another for Seminar/Classes (b) building the Library with specially designed book-cases and a small lounge, and (c) developing a state-of-the-art seminar/classroom equipped with modern seminar table and chairs, a white board for class room use, a 64" TV, drop in movie screen and audio-visual equipment. We are glad to report that phase I (construction of two rooms) and Phase II are complete, Hopefully, Phase III of the Library will become a reality when the required finances are forthcoming.

Additionally, linguistic, cultural, religious and heritage education for children is facilitated elsewhere or is completely absent for want of classrooms. These needs have shaped a plan for a "Multi-purpose Community Hall" which the 2013 EC aims to bring to fruition. "Multipurpose Building" which is badly needed for the children's Religious and Cultural classes. Local, national and international meetings and seminars at the temple arranged by Library of Hinduism and others. Community volunteer hospital for many of our devotees who cannot afford to see the doctors due to lack of resources, Support the vision for making our Temple a role model for other temples.

I request and urge you to attend the General Body Meeting and lend your support to the efforts of the 2013 EC to improve facilities at the Temple for our collective benefit.




