

Hindu Rituals and Routines and why do we follow them?

Why do we chant Om? Koti Sreekrishna

Om is one of the most chanted mantra by the Hindus. It has a profound effect on the body and mind of the one who chants and also on the surroundings. Most mantras start with Om.

Om is made up of the letters A (phonetically as in "around"), U (phonetically as in "put") and M (phonetically as in "mum"). The sound emerging from the vocal chords starts from the base of the throat as "A". With the coming together of the lips, "U" is formed and when the lips are closed, all sounds end in "M".

The three letters symbolize the three states (waking, dream and deep sleep), the three deities (Brahma, Vishnu, Shiva), the three Vedas (Rig, Yajur and Sama) the three worlds (Bhuh, Bhuvah, Suvah) etc. The Lord is all these and beyond. Om refers to Brahman, the Supreme. Om is also called *pranava* that means, "that (symbol or sound) by which the Lord is praised". The entire essence of the Vedas is enshrined in the word Om. The Om chant should have the resounding sound of a bell (*aaooommm*). Om symbolizes everything - the means and the goal of life, the world and the Truth behind it, the material and the Sacred, all form and the Formless. It is also sacred to Jainism, Buddhism and Sikhism.

Why do we do Aarati?

Towards the conclusion of worship, we perform the aarati in which a lighted lamp placed in a plate or simply held in hand is waved in clockwise direction in front of the deity or deities on altar. It is accompanied by the ringing of the bell and by singing, playing of musical instruments and clapping. It is one of the sixteen steps (*shodasha upachaara*) of worship. As the light is waved we either do mental or loud chanting of prayers or simply behold the beautiful form of the Lord, illumined by the lamp. Having worshipped a Deity - performing abhisheka, decorating the image and offering fruits and delicacies, we adore the beauty of the Deity. Our minds are focused on each limb of the Deity as the lamp lights it up. It is akin to silent open-eyed meditation on the Supreme. The singing, clapping, ringing of the bell etc. denote the joy and auspiciousness, which accompanies the vision of the Deity.

Aarati is often performed by lighting camphor placed in a small container or by lighting a cotton wick soaked with oil or ghee and placed in a small container (Diya). The lighted camphor or wick is allowed to burn until all camphor, oil or ghee has exhausted. Camphor, oil or ghee represents our ego. When lit by the fire of knowledge which illumines the Lord (Truth), our ego which keeps us separate from God is completely destroyed. During the aarati, even as we start out admiring the Deity, our eyes inevitably close automatically as if to look within. This is to signify that God resides within each of us and each of us is a temple of the Lord. Just as the priest reveals the form of the Lord clearly with the *aarati* flame, so too the guru reveals to us the divinity within each of us with the help of the "flame" of knowledge (or the light of spiritual knowledge). At the end of the *aarati*, we place our hands over the flame and then touch our eyes and the top of the head. It means - may the light that illuminated the Lord light up my vision; may my vision be divine and my thoughts noble and beautiful.

The philosophical meaning of *aarati* extends further. The sun, moon, stars, lightning and fire are the natural sources off light. God is the source of this wonderous phenomenon of the universe. It is due to God alone that all else exist andd shine. As we do aarati, we turn our attention to the very source of all light, which symbolizes knowledge and life as observed in one of the Upanishads: *Na tatra suryo bhaati na chandra taarakam Nemaa vidyuto bhaanti kuto-yamagnib Tameva bhaantam anubhaati sarvam Tasya bhasa sarvam idam vibhaati*

Where the sun does not shine, nor the moon, stars and lightning, then what to talk of this small fame (in my hand). Everything (in the universe) shines only after the Lord. And by God alone are we all illumined.

CERTIFICATE COURSE IN HINDUISM June 1 to June 30, 2013

Times: Saturdays, 10:30 - 12:30; 2:00 - 5:00 p.m.

Instructor: Professor S. S. Rama Rao Pappu (Professor of Philosophy & Comparative Religion, Miami University

Introduction: Hindu civilization and culture has an unbroken continuity for over three thousand years during which the Hindus have developed distinctive ways of thinking living and acting in the world. There are nearly 1.2 billion Hindus, most of whom live in India. This course examines Hindu history and civilization, philosophies and religion, arts and literature as a culture's self-understanding and self-expression of its ideas, values and ways of thinking.

Course Objectives: 1. This course presents a scholarly understanding of the Hindu mind and culture in its depth and richness, variety and profundity, dispelling the media myths and images which mould the attitudes and perspectives of a large number of people.

- 2. This course will prepare you to a better understanding of the Hindu tradition and your role as a Hindu in the USA which is a predominantly Christian nation, by providing you with categorical frameworks and conceptual meanings to communicate better with other religious believers. (As a citizen of the United States it is likely that yourself, your children, your friends and neighbors have pointed questions on Hinduism, which you might be unable to give a satisfactory answer. (e.g. What is the Sacred Scripture of the Hindus like the Bible for Christianity? Is Hinduism monotheistic or polytheistic? What is sacred about the sacred cow? Is Caste integral to Hinduism? What is the relation between Hinduism and Buddhism, Jainism?)
- 4. **Registration**: Attendance at the class is by prior registration only. A nominal fee of \$ 100 will be charged to cover the cost of class room materials and travel expenses of the invited scholars. About 20-25 students will be admitted to the class to enable greater interaction between the professor and the students.

All classes will be held in the Hinduism Library/Class room in the lower part of the Temple.

The Hinduism Library and Classroom project was envisioned by Laxmi Shankar Srivastava. He felt the need for the devotees to pursue the path of Jnana Yoga also. Major funding for the Library infra-structure, custom designed book cases, furniture etc. was funded by Rama Rao Pappu in memory of his wife Suryakantham Pappu. Rama Rao Pappu has also donated 2,500 books.






