

JANAMASHTMI

Janmashtami also known as Gokulashtami is celebrated all over the country with great gusto. On this auspicious day, Lord Krishna took birth to end the wickedness which was growing day by day during those days. This day holds great significance among the Hindus and the ardent followers of Lord Krishna observe fast. India is a country of diversity and thus, there is a slight difference in the rituals and traditions which are followed in various parts of the country. People sing bhajans, give performances on the life and great achievements of Lord Krishna during this festive time. The idols of Lord Krishna are decorated very beautifully and the houses and temples are also adorned to welcome Lord Krishna. Till the date, Lord Krishna is showing His followers the path of honesty, truth and kindness through the holy book called Bhagavad Gita. Read the article to know more about the importance of Janmashtami along with the date on which it will be celebrated in 2013.

When Is Janmashtami Celebrated

According to the Hindu calendar, Janmashtami is celebrated on the 8th day of the Krishna Paksh or the dark half under the nakshtra Rohini, in the month of Shravana whereas as per the Gregorian calendar, it comes in the month of mid August-September. The Shravana month corresponds to the month of Bhadrapada Krishnapaksha, according to Barhapatyamana. It is said that Lord Krishna took birth in the year of Visvavasu, about 5,227 years ago. He was the avatar of Lord Krishna which came to the earth in Dwapara Yuga.

In present time, this festival is rejoiced for over two days because the nakshatra called Rohini and the 8th day of Krishna Paksh may not fall on the same day. This is why this festival is celebrated for two days, in which the first day is known as Krishnashtami, as on this day Lord Krishna took birth which comes on the eighth day after the festive occasion of Raksha Bandhan whereas the second day is called as Kalashtami.

Significance of Janmashtami

The festivities of Janmashtami start at midnight because it is said that God made his celestial appearance on the earth during this time. Conch is blown and the idol of Lord Krishna is given a consecrated bath with panchamrit and then with gangajal. After this, people perform special puja, perform aarti, offer sweets, fruits and fresh flowers as a tribute to the God. Also, they rock the cradle which indicates that Lord Krishna has taken birth. After performing the rituals, people break their fast by having the prasad.

The main objective of the coming of Lord Krishna on this earth was to make the people and the Mother Earth free from the evilness of the demons. He also played a very significant role in Mahabharata which was the legendary battle took place in Kurukshetra. Swami Vivekananda

150th Birth Anniversary: 1863-1902

Swami Vivekananda was/is a well known spiritual giant of India who became famous with his representation of Hinduism at the Parliament of Religions held in Chicago in 1893. His deep spiritual insight, fervid eloquence, brilliant conversation, broad human sympathy, and inspirational personality made an irresistible appeal to any one who came in contact with him.

In America Vivekananda's mission was the interpretation of India's spiritual culture, especially in its Vedantic setting. He also tried to enrich the religious

consciousness of the Americans through the rational and humanistic teachings of the Vedanta philosophy. In America he became India's spiritual ambassador and pleaded eloquently for better understanding between India and the New World in order to create a healthy synthesis of East and West, of religion and science.

Vivekananda strove to promote peace and human brotherhood on the spiritual foundation of the Vedantic Oneness of existence. A mystic of the highest order, Vivekananda had a direct and intuitive experience of Reality. He derived his ideas from that unfailing source of wisdom and often presented them in the soul stirring language of poetry. In the course of a short life of thirty-nine years (1863-1902), he wrote a treasure of literature on Hindu philosophy and organized the Ramakrishna Order of monks, which is the most outstanding religious organization of modern India.

My ideal, indeed, can be put into a few words, and that is: to preach unto mankind their divinity, and how to make it manifest in every movement of life.

So long as the millions live in hunger and ignorance, I hold every man a traitor who, having been educated at their expense, pays not the least heed to them.

Whatever you think, that you will be. If you think yourselves weak, weak you will be; if you think yourselves strong, strong you will be.

If you have faith in all the three hundred and thirty millions of your mythological gods, ... and still have no faith in your-✓ selves, there is no salvation for you. Have faith in yourselves, and stand up on that faith and be strong; that is what we need.

Purity, patience, and perseverance are the three essentials to success, and above all, love.

Religion is realization; not talk, not doctrine, nor theories, however beautiful they may be. It is being and becoming, or not hearing or acknowledging; it is the whole soul becoming changed into what it believes.

Religion is the manifestation of the Divinity already in man.


They alone live who live for others, the rest are more dead than alive.

It is love and love alone that I preach, and I base my teaching on the great Vedantic truth of the sameness and ominpresence of the Soul of the Universe.

"Learn to love with all your heart and accept the unlovable side of others. For anyone can love a rose, but only a great heart can include the thorns."




Fifteen Laws of Life by Swami Vivekananda

- 1. Love Is The Law Of Life: All love is expansion, all selfishness is contraction. Love is therefore the only law of life. He who loves lives, he who is selfish is dying. Therefore, love for love's sake, because it is law of life, just as you breathe to live.
- 2. It is Your Outlook That Matters: It is our own mental attitude, which makes the world what it is for us. Our thoughts make things beautiful, our thoughts make things ugly. The whole world is in our own minds. Learn to see things in the proper light.



- 3. Life is Beautiful: First, believe in this world that there is meaning behind everything. Everything in the world is good, is holy and beautiful. If you see something evil, think that you do not understand it in the right light. Throw the burden on yourself.
- 4. It's The Way You Feel: Feel like Christ and you will be a Christ; feel like Buddha and you will be a Buddha. It is feeling that is the life, the strength, the vitality, without which no amount of intellectual activity can reach God.
- 5. Set Yourself Free: The moment I have realized God sitting in the temple of every human body, the moment I stand in reverence before every human being and see God in him that moment I am free from bondage, everything that binds vanishes, and I am free.
- 6. Don't Play the Blame Game: Condemn none: if you can stretch out a helping hand, do so. If you cannot, fold your hands, bless your brothers, and let them go their own way.
- 7. Help Others: If money helps a man to do good to others, it is of some value; but if not, it is simply a mass of evil, and the sooner it is got rid of, the better.
- 8. Uphold Your Ideals: Our duty is to encourage everyone in his struggle to live up to his own highest ideal, and strive at the same time to make the ideal as near as possible to the Truth.
- 9. Listen to Your Soul: You have to grow from the inside out. None can teach you, none can make you spiritual. There is no other teacher but your own soul.
- 10. Be Yourself: The greatest religion is to be true to your own nature. Have faith in yourselves!
- 11. Nothing Is Impossible: Never think there is anything impossible for the soul. It is the greatest heresy to think so. If there is sin, this is the only sin to say that you are weak, or others are weak.
- 12. You Have the Power: All the powers in the universe are already ours. It is we who have put our hands before our eyes and cry that it is dark.
- 13. Learn Everyday: The goal of mankind is knowledge... now this knowledge is inherent in man. No knowledge comes from outside: it is all inside. What we say a man 'knows', should, in strict psychological language, be what he 'discovers' or 'unveils'; what man 'learns' is really what he discovers by taking the cover off his own soul, which is a mine of infinite knowledge.
- 14. Be Truthful: Everything can be sacrificed for truth, but truth cannot be sacrificed for anything.
- 15. Think Different: All differences in this world are of degree, and not of kind, because oneness is the secret of everything.

Immortal Words of Swami Vivekananda



A tribute on his 150th Birth Anniversary

- Those who work at a thing heart & soul not only achieve success in it but through their absorption in that they also realize the supreme truth—Brahman. Those who work at a thing with their whole heart receive help from God.
- We believe that every being is divine, is God. Every soul is a sun covered over with clouds of ignorance; the difference between soul and soul is owing to the difference in density of these layers of clouds.
- · Don't look back; forward, infinite energy, infinite enthusiasm, infinite daring, and infinite patience; then alone can great deeds be accomplished.
- · God is merciful to those whom He sees struggling heart and soul for realization. But remain idle, without any struggle, and you will see that His grace will never come.
- This is the first lesson to learn: be determined not to curse anything outside, not to lay the blame upon anyone outside, but stand up, lay the blame on yourself. You will find that is always true. Get hold of yourself.
- · This life is a hard fact; work your way through it boldly, though it may be adamantine; no matter, the soul is stronger.
- The whole secret of existence is to have no fear. Never fear what will become of you, depend on no one. Only the moment you reject all help, are you free.
- · Great work requires great and persistent effort for a long time. ... Character has to be established through a thousand stumbles.
 - · We reap what we sow. We are the makers of our own fate. None else has the blame, none has the praise.
- · I, for one, thoroughly believe that no power in the universe can withhold from anyone anything they really deserve.
- · What the world wants is character. The world is in need of those whose life is one burning love, selfless. That love will make every word tell like a thunderbolt.
- Fear is death, fear is sin, fear is hell, fear is unrighteousness, fear is wrong life. All the negative thoughts and ideas that are in the world have proceeded from this evil spirit of fear.
- · Why are people so afraid? The answer is that they have made themselves helpless and dependent on others. We are so lazy, we do not want to do anything ourselves. We want a Personal God, a Savior or a Prophet to do everything for us.
- · As long as we believe ourselves to be even the least different from God, fear remains with us; but when we know ourselves to be the One, fear goes; of what can we be afraid?
- · We have to go back to philosophy to treat things as they are. We are suffering from our own karma. It is not the fault of God. What we do is our own fault, nothing else. Why should God be blamed?
- Even the greatest fool can accomplish a task if it were after his or her heart. But the intelligent ones are those who can convert every work into one that suits their taste.
- · Fill the brain with high thoughts, highest ideals, place them day and night before you, and out of that will come great work.
 - · Watch people do their most common actions; these are indeed the things that will tell you the real character of a great person.
- · Our first duty is not to hate ourselves, because to advance we must have faith in ourselves first and then in God. Those who have no faith in themselves can never have faith in God.
- This I have seen in life—those who are overcautious about themselves fall into dangers at every step; those who are afraid of losing honor and respect, get only disgrace; and those who are always afraid of loss, always lose.

Rules and Regulations for Naach Sitare

Participation requirements: Entries will be taken on first come first basis.

- The committee keeps the right to select items depending on the time, logistics and to have maximum community participation.
- Repetition of same songs will not be permitted to keep program entertaining.
- No exceptions will be made.
- No specific age group for group performance.
- One participant can participate in one solo and one group dance at the most.
- Each team must have a minimum of 3 participants for group dance.

<u>Solo Dance</u>: A total of up to 20 solo entries will be taken. Auditions may be required. Preference will be given to different dance styles.

<u>Group Dance</u>: A total of up to 20 group entries will be taken, preference will be given to groups with more number of participants and new dance styles.

Timings and Scheduling:

- Each dance item will be limited 6 minutes. If the time limit is exceeded, team will not qualify for awards.
- Only 2 minutes are allowed for stage preparation (includes general introductions) before the dance performance, and only 1 minute allowed after performance to clean the stage.

Props and Lighting:

- Props hanging from the ceiling will not be allowed.
- Each team should have a representative overseeing audio playback & other arrangements

Judges:

- Professional judges will be selected by the committee.
- Judges will refrain from discussion.
- All judges will be in receipt of the rules and regulations.
- For fairness, judges will disclose participants of immediate family members in the competition item.
- The judge's decision will be final.
- No grievances will be entertained.






