

SIGNIFICANCE OF SHRAADH

The dark fortnight of Ashwin Month is known as Mahalaya Paksha/ Pitrapaksha or the fortnight especially sacred for offering oblations to the departed ancestors. The last day of this period, the new moon day (Amavasya), is considered as the most important day in the year for performing obsequies and rites (or in simple terms offerings to our dearly departed ancestors). The Shraddh performed during Pitru Paksha are not funeral ceremonies. They are Yagyas for the Pitru, worship of the ancestors as deities. They are different from the worship of the God. Shraddha is mainly performed for three generations of Pitrus, namely the father, the grandfather, and the great grandfather. When performed for all the ancestors, performer's family gets benefit

SIGNIFICANCE OF NAVRATARI



India is a land of Festivals. During the Festival of Navratri, the different forms of Durga are wor-

shipped. Goddess Durga is invoked first to remove impurities from the mind. The Goddess Lakshmi is invoked to cultivate the noble values and qualities. Goddess Saraswati is invoked for gaining the highest knowledge of the Self. On the tenth day we celebrate Dussehra/ Vijayadasami, the day of true victory.

Man, the imperfect, the bound, the sorrowful, has a thousand enemies within. He is riddled with negative thoughts fears, yearnings. These are selfishness, jealousy, meanness, prejudice and hatred – just to mention but a few. With Mother Durga's kripa, these negative forces are to be annihilated.

Victory Over Mahishasura

According to a very popular legend, Mahishasura, the mighty demon worshipped Lord Shiva and obtained invincible power. Soon, he started killing the innocent lives on earth and set out to win the seven lokas. He acquired the swarglok. Nobody could save the living creatures from his tyranny. Even the three mighty gods of the Hindu Trinity - Lord Brahma, Lord Vishnu and Lord Shiva - were unable to defeat him. Therefore, all the gods, including the Hindu Trinity, united their supreme powers and created a divine being called Ma Shakti or Durga, the Warrior Goddess who came to earth and destroyed Mahishasura (symbolizing our negative qualities which we need to conquer) during these nine days and nights. Goddess Durga killed Mahishasura on the tenth day. Consequently, she lifted the tyranny of the demon off the innocent lives on earth and restored the swarglok to the devatas (Gods). Therefore, Navratri is celebrated to commemorate her victory over the demon, which symbolizes the victory of the good over the evil. Yet another legend of Navratri relates to the Hindu epic Ramayana. It goes that Lord Rama worshipped Goddess Durga in nine aspects, for nine days, in order to gather the strength and power to kill Ravana. He wanted to release Sita from the clutches of powerful demon king Ravana, who had abducted her. Those nine nights became to be known as Navratri and the tenth day, on which Lord Rama killed Ravana, came to be called Vijayadashmi or Dusshera, signifying

The First Three Days of Navratri

Rama's (good) triumph over Ravana (evil).

The first three days of Navratri are devoted to the worship of the Goddess Durga. This is the period, when her energy and power are worshipped. Each day is dedicated to a different appearance of Durga. Kumari, which signifies the girl child, is worshipped on the first day of the festival. Parvati, who is the embodiment of a young woman, is worshipped on the second day. The destructive aspects of Goddess Durga symbolize the commitment to acquire triumph over all the evil tendencies. Hence, on the third day of Navratri, Goddess Kali is worshipped, who represents the woman who has reached the stage of maturity.

Fourth to Sixth Days of Navratri

When a person acquires triumph over evil tendencies of ego, anger, lust and other animal instincts, he/she experiences a void. This void is filled with spiritual wealth. For the purpose, the person approaches Goddess Lakshmi, to acquire all the materialistic, spiritual wealth and prosperity. This is the reason why the fourth, fifth and sixth day of Navratri are dedicated to the worship of Lakshmi - the goddess of prosperity and peace.

Seventh and Eighth Day (Ashtmi) of Navratri

The seventh day is dedicated to worshipping Saraswati, the goddess of art and knowledge. Prayers are offered with an aim to seek spiritual knowledge.

Although the individual has acquired victory over evil tendencies and has power and wealth, he is still deprived of true knowledge. A 'yagna' is performed on the eight day. Offering is made out of clarified butter (ghee), rice pudding known as kheer and sesame seeds. Kanya puja is performed to worship nine young girls, who have not yet reached the stage of puberty. These nine girls symbolize one of the nine forms of goddess Durga. The feet of girls are washed to welcome the goddess and show respect to her. The girls are offered gifts from the devotees.

Ninth Day of Navratri

The ninth day is the final day of Navratri celebrations. It is also known as 'Mahanavami'. On this day, this festival is celebrated with gusto in different regions of the country. In the eastern state of West Bengal, the festival takes the shape of Durga Puja, when the devotees of the deity celebrate the triumph of good over evil. There, Ma Durga is worshipped as Goddess Shakti. In north India, Maharashtra and Gujarat, people observe a seven day fast during Navratri and break their fast on Ashtami (the eighth day of the festival) by worshiping young girls. However, some people observe fast until the Ashtami and break their fast only on Navami (the ninth day).



BENEFITS OF FASTING

The purpose of fasting (for religious reasons) is not to suffer but to guard against gluttony as well as lying, cheating, out-bursts of uncontrolled lusts and desires, and impure thoughts, words and deeds. Fasting also fosters humility as one experiences a life that others who are less fortunate have to endure on a daily basis. Some faiths encourage, that money saved from fasting, be donated in some form of charity, for to reach out in love to others is part and parcel of true fasting.

The physical benefits of a period of fasting are believed to be many: mainly it is said to detoxify the body and improve overall health. However, a deeper and more significant aspect is the spiritual accomplishment. Fasting engenders self-control and discipline. Certainly the pursuit of fasting is more than just abstinence, it is recognized as a path to a higher consciousness. Fasting is a very integral part of the Hindu religion. One may fast for almost any reason; a birth, a death, to find a good husband, for prosperity, to honor a particular deity, to celebrate the full moon and fasting during religious festivals is also very common. Interestingly Hindus also fast for a whole month during *Shraavan mas*, the Hindu holy month.

During any fast, the intention behind any deed should be positive. To check intention implies checking one's heart. Is my heart pure and clean enough to fill with the presence of the Divine? When I am generous and kind is there a subtle expectation of a return, of recognition, that will dilute this good deed, this seed?

During fasting, reflect on the general quality of life. Am I truly living my purpose and meaning? Fasting strengthens the mind and body and helps us appreciate all the goodness that we are surrounded by.

Fasting is not a penance, but a tried and proven way of teaching us that nothing in life comes easily but that with effort and sacrifice we can become masters of ourselves.

It's Time... to step back from the palate and give the organs a bit of a break. Take the time you save from cooking and cleaning to reflect on your inner compass of life – are you on the right path? Check the intentions behind your deeds – are they clean and generous. And when it is time to "break the fast", do so mindfully being aware to feed the mind as well as the body by resuming a diet of positive, peaceful, and beneficial thoughts, words and deeds.

NAVRATRI FASTING PROCEDURE

On the festive occasion of Navratri, fast is observed by people for seven or eight days, depending upon when they want to conduct the Kanchika Pujan (when young girls are worshipped). The devotees, who have observed fast, would get up early in the morning, take bath and offer prayers to the deity. People follow a specific diet for Navratri. Singhare ka atta (kuttu ka atta) is used to prepare rotis or puris, for the fast.

One may drink beverages like tea, coffee and milk, on Navratri. Dishes made of sago and potato is generally consumed by the people, when they observe fast on Navratri. Sendha namak (rock salt) is used instead of common salt, for cooking on the festival. All fruits and foodstuff made of fruits are eaten during the seven days. Certain restaurants in the northern parts of India would offer special menu for the people, who have observed fast on Navratri.

After seven days of fasting, people would break their fast on the eighth day - Ashtami - by worshipping young girls. The ritual of offering prasad to the young girls is called Kanchika Pujan. As per the tradition, puris (deep fried Indian bread), halwa (sweet dish made of suji) and Bengal gram curry are served to the young girls, called upon by the people who have observed fast. After seeking the blessings of the young girls (kanchikayen), the devotees would break their fast by consuming the prasad (puri, halwa and sabzi) that they have prepared for them. While this is the tradition followed by majority of people, Navratri fast is also broken on ninth day (Navami), wherein the fast is observed until Ashtami. The same procedure is followed in that case as well.

Kaddu Ki Sabzi Recipe

Ingredients

- 1/2 kg Kaddu (pumpkin/ sitaphal), peeled and cubed
- 1/2 tsp Turmeric Powder
- 2-3 Green Chilies, chopped
- Salt to taste
- 1/4 tsp Garam Masala Powder
- 1/2 tsp Coriander Powder
- 1 tsp Sugar
- 1/2 tsp Amchoor (dried mango powder)
- 1/2 tsp Methi Dana (fenugreek seeds)
- A pinch of Hing (asafetida)

1 tbsp Oil

Method

- Heat oil in a pan and add methi dana and when it changes color, add hing, green chilies and sauté for 1 minute.
- Now add kaddu pieces, turmeric, coriander powders, and salt and mix it well. Add 1 tsp water and cook on a lower heat till kaddu turns tender.

Add sugar, amchoor and garam masala powder and mix well. Cook on low heat for 2 minutes and continue cooking till all the water evaporates

<u>Saboodana Vadaa Recipe</u>

Ingredients

1 cup Saboodana

- 1/2 cup Peanuts (roasted & crushed coarsely)
- 1 Potato (boiled, peeled & mashed)
- 7-8 Green Chilies (crushed)
- Salt to taste

Oil to deep fry

Method

- Wash sago thoroughly and drain excess water. Soak it for 2-3 hours.
- Add all ingredients to it except oil. Mix well into a paste.
- Keep the oil in a deep frying pan to heat. Moist hands and make small flat.
- Slide the rounds in the heated oil on medium flame. Fry till they are crisp and light brown in color.
 Drain them well using a sieve type ladle. Makes about 10 vadaas and serve with peanut chutney.






