### Dear HSGC members, devotees, and temple supporters,

I hope that all of you had a wonderful Dusshera, Diwali, and the New Year celebration. We had a very busy time with these events both inside and outside the temple. We had an extremely well attended Dusshera and Navratri celebration at the temple and at the Cincinnati Mills location.

We had a fantastic Diwali Mahalakshmi Pooja at the temple on Nov 11<sup>th</sup>. The pooja was attended by over 1,000 devotees. Afterwards, the children and parents alike enjoyed the sparkers, firecrackers and spinners. It was a real Diwali like atmosphere that reminded many of their childhood days in India.

We had the Diwali cultural night on Nov 14<sup>th</sup> at the Atrium Hotel. It was a full house at the Atrium where all guests enjoyed a very tasty and sumptuous dinner. It was followed by a fabulous musical evening. The group from Mumbai called the Panorama Group had very accomplished singers and musicians, some of whom had performed in the orchestras of the likes of Shankar-Jaikishen. The theme of the program was Binaca Geetmala. The top songs of this famed series over 25 years were performed by this group. It was truly a "don't miss" program.

We celebrated a very well attended Annakut/Govardhan Pooja/Tulsi Vivah as well on Nov 23rd.

The executive committee of the temple is looking at the growing needs of the temple. We are getting more devotees visiting the temple, the number of programs that get large attendance is also increasing and there is demand from several devotee groups for bringing additional deities to the temple. We also have a long felt need for a multi-purpose community center that will cater to multiple needs. Therefore, we have drawn up a long range expansion plan for the temple that will cater to the multiple needs. A summary of the plan is provided below.

- There will be addition of two wings (north and south) to the temple to accommodate needs of groups
  interested in bringing additional deities and/or to create more space for larger devotee attendance for the
  deities.
- 2. There will be expansion of the temple in the front and back of the temple.
- 3. The front entrance project has the following objectives:
- a. Provide the aesthetic appeal of a proper Hindu temple entrance
- b. Provide facility for coat hangers and shoe racks at the main level so that there will be no need to enter the temple from the side entrance
- c. Provide additional rest rooms at the main level to cater to the increasing attendance at the temple
- d. Provide all these facilities as part of the enclosed building to avoid exposure to the weather elements while entering the temple.
- 4. The expansion at the back will consist of a multi-purpose community center that will serve as a place of marriages, major religious events, social gatherings as well as additional educational and cultural needs.
- 5. The front and back expansion will be funded by general devotee base and it will be treated as a single project from fund-raising perspective.
- 6. We are in the process of drawing up the estimates for the expansion. We will be in constant communication with all of you through Aradhana, the website and special email blasts.

We feel confident that if the entire community gets behind this project, we can accomplish these goals in a very short order. The benefits of these projects to the community will be enormous. So let us set our sights high for the coming year 2016 and work hard to attain these goals.

Minutes: The minutes of the previous meetings of the EC on Aug 2, 2015 were not reviewed.

### **Committee Updates**

The EC discussed the current and the proposed rates for poojas and funeral services.

- A charge of \$201.00 for the services of the priests at funerals was agreed.
- Pooja Committee to finalize all other pooja rates revisions and bring it to the EC

The Pooja Committee also agreed to compile a comprehensive check list to be used before the release of the deposits charged for kitchen rentals. The EC discussed the need to conduct poojas and other temple events promptly on a timely basis to avoid complaints from devotees. Pooja Committee agreed to take this up with the priests for discussion. It was agreed to advertise in Aradhana to arrest the declining trend of food sponsorships.

### **Relationship with Umiya Mata Devotees**

The EC discussed the following:

- The need accommodate the devotee base as part of the HSGC.
- Arrange a meeting with them to discuss the future master plan (only) of the HSGC, including the construction of the proposed multi purpose building within a short time.

Chris Gallagher of the Gallagher HVAC Services made an initial presentation of the different options and the related costs and savings of the project. ### **Committee Updates**

- 1. Bill Fiedler presented the master plan for the expansion of the temple building based on prior input from long range planning discussions.
- The EC approved addition of two wings (north and south) to the temple to accommodate the needs of groups interested in bringing additional deities and/or to create more space for larger devotee attendance for the deities.
- 3. The addition of the wings will be solely funded by the specific devotee groups and the funds from the general devotee base will not be used for the expansion of the wings.
- 4. Some deities may be relocated (in the south wing) due to the redesign of the wing.
- 5. As a result, fund raising for the north and south wing addition can proceed.
- 6. The EC also discussed the expansion of the temple in the front and back of the temple.
- 7. The front entrance project has the following objectives:
  - a. Provide the aesthetic appeal of a proper Hindu temple entrance
  - Provide facility for coat hangers and shoe racks at the main level so that there
    will be no need to enter the temple from the side entrance
  - c. Provide additional rest rooms at the main level to cater to the increasing attendance at the temple
  - d. Provide all these facilities as part of the enclosed building to avoid exposure to the weather elements while entering the temple.
- 8. The expansion at the back will consist of a multi-purpose community center that will serve as a place of marriages, major religious events, social gatherings as well as additional educational and cultural needs.
- 9. The front and back expansion will be funded by general devotee base and it will be treated as a single project from fund-raising perspective.
- 10. The cost estimates for the front and back expansion will be prepared before final approval of the expansion.
- 11. The temple phone numbers will be consolidated into a single phone number with a calling tree for streamlining the various functions within the temple.

New Year's Day is observed on <u>January 1</u>, the first day of the year on the modern <u>Gregorian calendar</u> as well as the <u>Julian calendar</u>. As a date in the Gregorian calendar of <u>Christendom</u>, New Year's Day liturgically marked the <u>Feast of the Circumcision of Christ</u>, and is still observed as such in the <u>Anglican Church</u> and <u>Lutheran Church</u>. In present day, with most countries now using the Gregorian calendar as their <u>de facto</u> calendar, New Year's Day is probably the most celebrated public <u>holiday</u>, often observed with <u>fireworks</u> at the stroke of <u>midnight</u> as the new year starts in each time zone

Diwali related New Years celebrations include Marwari New Year and Gujrati New Year.

Indian New Year's days has several variations depending on the region and is based on the Hindu calendar.

Hindu In Hinduism, different regional cultures celebrate new year at different times of the year. In Assam, Bengal, Kerala, Nepal, Orissa, Punjab and Tamil Nadu, households celebrate the new year when the Sun enters Aries on the Hindu calendar. This is normally on April 14 or April 15, depending on the leap year. Elsewhere in northern/central India, the Vikram Samvat calendar is followed. According to that the new year day is the first day of the Chaitra Month, also known as Chaitra Shukla Pratipada or Gudi Padwa. This basically is the first month of the Hindu calendar, the first shukla paksha (fortnight) and the first day. This normally comes around March 23–24, mostly around the Spring Equinox in Gregorian Calendar. The new year is celebrated by paying respect to elders in the family and by seeking their blessings. They also exchange tokens of good wishes for a healthy and prosperous year ahead.

Tamil New Year (<u>Puthandu</u>) is celebrated on April 13 or April 14. Traditionally, it is celebrated as <u>Chiththirai Thirunaal</u> in parts of Tamil Nadu to mark the event of the Sun entering Aries. <u>Panchangam</u> (<u>almanac</u>), is read in temples to mark the start of the Year.

Telugu New Year (Ugadi), Kannada New Year (Yugadi) is celebrated in March (generally), April (occasionally). Traditionally, it is celebrated as Chaitram Chaitra Shuddha Padyami in parts of Andhra Pradesh and Karnataka to mark the event of New Year's Day for the people of the Deccan region of India. It falls on a different day every year because the Hindu calendar is a lunisolar calendar. The Saka calendar begins with the month of Chaitra (March–April) and Ugadi/Yugadi marks the first day of the new year. Chaitra is the first month in Panchanga which is the Indian calendar. Panchangam (almanac), is read in temples to mark the start of the Year.




